

A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

As much as the weather at times might try to fool us, Spring is here. One way you can be assured of that is to look around our property and see the mulch which has been spread and the plants which have been planted. We are very grateful to the parishioners and neighbors (please see the pictures on the INSERT of this bulletin) who volunteered to do this last Saturday. Others volunteered for Sunday, but I understand they got "rained out." Many thanks to all and especially Charlie Nygard who organized this effort.

Last Sunday night, as on the last Sunday of each month, we had approximately 30 parishioners (mostly young adults, but not all so young) join us in Carr Hall after the 7:00 PM Mass for a social. This gave new parishioners an opportunity to meet other parishioners and it gave the opportunity for others to 'catch up" with each other. It gives me the opportunity to socialize with parishioners. I am most grateful to Fernando, Aimee and Tom for facilitating the whole process. It is truly a wonderful service to the community. I am also grateful to "Rustica Pizza" (903 N 2nd St.) for donating the pizza to us.

As you look at the sanctuary of the church this weekend, you can see the restoration of the crucifixion painting has begun. This is certainly thanks to your donations to the Capital Campaign. Some have asked "why" and "why now." The "why" is because it was becoming an eye sore with one very severe crack in the painting and the beginning of another crack becoming evident. The painting by Hans Hansen has been part of our parish since 1900. It certainly deserves to look decent. The answer to 'why now" is that it will take 4-6 weeks to be completed and we needed to find a time when we had no scheduled weddings. Please excuse the disruption and appearance during this time. As they say, "temporary inconvenience for permanent improvement."

This is a good opportunity to point out that this is the eighth project to take place as a result of the Capital Campaign. The others include:

- ⇒ The conversion of the heating system (oil to natural gas) in a parish building
- ⇒ The conversion of the lighting in the church to LED lighting
- ⇒ The complete renovations of two restrooms in the church
- ⇒ The replacement of the 15 windows on the 4th St. side of the Women of Hope building
- ⇒ The securing of the Stations of the Cross
- ⇒ The initiation of a Preservation Account for the church building
- ⇒ The creation of a wheelchair accessible restroom (almost completed) in the church

There are two other major projects to begin very soon: the restoring of two skylights in the church and the replacement of 14 windows on the Lawrence St. side of the Women of Hope building.


As of this date, we have \$631,272 pledged (84% of our goal of \$750,000) to the Campaign. I am very grateful to all those who have donated to the campaign (about 152 persons) and I am certainly very grateful to the Steering Committee who has steered this entire effort and to the Parish Finance Commission who has offered their consultation since we began several years ago. Be sure to save the date of Saturday, June 1st to participate at Villanova in a major fundraiser for the campaign (5:00 PM to 9:00 PM): open bar, hors d'oeuvres, buffet dinner, tour the new pavilion, hear Jay Wright (Villanova basketball coach) speak, and an opportunity to win some door prizes and to bid for several live auction items. Jim Murray, former General Manager of the Philadelphia Eagles and co-founder of the Ronald McDonald Houses will be the Master of Ceremonies for the evening. Tickets are \$100. Think of family, friends, co-workers and enemies whom you could invite and who might make a pledge to the campaign. There will be more information soon about how to obtain tickets, maybe next week.

Lastly, please keep in your prayers 3 parishioners who are in their final stages of preparation to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation: Karen Connolly who will be baptized, make First Communion and be confirmed at the Easter Vigil (7:30 PM) on April 20th and Ashley Foreman who will make a Profession of Faith to the Church, be confirmed and will make First Communion and Tom White who will be confirmed at the 7:00 PM liturgy on Sunday, April 28th.
