A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

It is not an accident that the week which we are about to enter is called "Holy Week." It is truly the holiest week of the year. On Holy Thursday, Good Friday and at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening, we celebrate what is known as the Triduum, meaning three-day festival. This is the celebration of three very central mysteries of our faith. It is technically one liturgy.

At our Holy Thursday celebration (7:30 PM), we will celebrate the gift of the Eucharist, the institution of the Priesthood, receive the Holy Oils (to be used throughout the year for Baptisms, Confirmations, and the Sacrament of the Sick) blessed Holy Thursday morning at the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral by Archbishop Pérez. We also will recall how Jesus modeled service for us by washing the feet of his disciples.

At our Good Friday service (3:00 PM), we will recall the Passion of Jesus, have an opportunity to venerate the Cross, and receive the Eucharist. (This is not a Mass, but part of the one entire liturgy of the Triduum).

At the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday (7:30 PM), we celebrate the central mystery of our faith, the Resurrection of Jesus. St. Paul says that if Jesus did not rise from the dead our faith is in vain. We begin the Vigil (I call it the Super Bowl of liturgies) outside in darkness by lighting the Easter Fire and extending the light from the Easter Fire to the Paschal Candle (used at every Baptism and funeral for the next year), to each person as we enter a dark church and then sing the Exsultet, the Proclamation of Easter. We hear the history of our salvation, with the church gradually being lit, as a sign that Jesus has brought us from darkness into light. Within the Easter Vigil, April Bialas and Christine Rihn will be initiated into the Roman Catholic Church when they are baptized, confirmed and receive the Eucharist for the first time. We also will renew our own baptismal promises for which we have been preparing all Lent.

On Good Friday evening (7:30 PM), independent of the Triduum, at a prayer service, we will reflect on the Seven Last Words. Some would say "The last seven what?" Although it can be traced to the sixteenth century, many people have never heard of this prayer service. The Seven Last Words are the last seven sentences, phrases or sayings uttered by Jesus as he hung on the Cross on Good Friday. I have asked members of our parish community (and one person not of the parish) to share reflections on the last words of Jesus and how these sayings may relate to them and to us today. I tried to have participants who represent a good cross section of our parish. Those who are sharing reflections are four men and four women who are Filipino and Caucasian parishioners among whom are several young adults, a married couple, and a relatively newly ordained Augustinian priest. The Seven Last Words and those sharing reflections on them are:

"Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do." Luke 23: 26-37 Matt Halpin "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise." Luke 23: 39-43 Dakota Roman "Woman, behold your son..... son, behold your mother." John 19: 26-27 Lala Borres "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Mark 15: 33-39 Brittany Cory "I thirst." John 19. 28-29 Fr. Jeremy Heirs, OSA

"It is finished." John 19:29-30 Beverley and Francisco Buella

"Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Luke 23: 44-49 Maria Roberts-Reyes

All of our Holy Week services will be in person and for those who are homebound, they will be live streamed. It you are physically able, it is preferable to be with us in person. The purpose of livestreaming our services is so that those who cannot be with us physically can be with us virtually.

As you can see, this is truly a Holy Week. I hope as many as possible can participate with us in these beautiful and rich liturgies.

May this truly be a Holy Week for you.
