





# A word from Fr. Bill...

#### Dear Parishioners:

Throughout the entire world this Sunday is Divine Mercy Sunday. It is a day when we are asked to center in on the mercy and forgiveness of our heavenly God. God's mercy is central to all the elements involved in our Easter celebration. Because of God's mercy, forgiveness is extended to us thru the suffering, death and Resurrection of Jesus. Out of God's mercy, Jesus destroyed death and restored life. He has moved us from darkness to light. A great way to experience that mercy, that new life and light is in the Sacrament of Penance which is made available after each of our Sunday Masses.

A sincere "shout out" to all who made the celebration of the Triduum so beautiful. There were many people involved who made these liturgies so prayerful: my Augustinian brothers, those involved as choir members, instrumentalists, cantors and their director (Kim Barasso); those involved in making the environment so beautiful (Rey Borres); those involved in helping the liturgies go so smoothly, the lectors and altar servers, and Master of Ceremonies (Jacob Marquart, O.F.S.); those involved with the social after the Easter Vigil (Ruth and Ferdi Lunyun). "It takes a parish community." A sincere thanks to one and all.

As has been announced for the past few weeks, Ted Baker who has been part of the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) process since September will make a profession of faith to the Catholic Church this Sunday at the 7:00 PM Mass. He also will be confirmed and receive the Eucharist for the first time.

Ted will not be baptized as he was baptized when he was 18 into the Church of Christ in Williamstown, NJ. He went to LeMoyne College in Syracuse, New York. His years there were very significant as it was at LeMoyne where he became more familiar with the Catholic Church. It was also there that he met Kharisma Goldston with whom he celebrated the Sacrament of Marriage here at St. Augustine this past July 2nd.

Ted is now 32 and works at the Philadelphia Navy Yard as a network engineer. He was present in church at our Rite of Acceptance on the 1st Sunday of Advent in 2021. This experience gave him the incentive and motivation to participate in this process himself.

Since last September, Ted has been meeting regularly (about 30 times) with his sponsor, Ryan Langton, our parish representative, Patrick Lanza, his wife, Kharisma and me. We have discussed every aspect of the Catholic faith, the Church's beliefs, practices and attitudes. To name several, this includes: prayer, the Mass, scripture, the saints, Mary, Jesus, the sacraments, social teachings of the Church, heaven, hell, etc. After this Sunday, we will discuss living within the Church: the call to holiness, what opportunities there are to share his gifts in the community, and evangelization, etc.

Ted also participated in other significant events: the Rite of Acceptance on the 1st Sunday of Advent, the Rite of Election with Archbishop Pérez at the Cathedral on the 1st Sunday of Lent, the 3 Scrutinies during Lent and a Day of Recollection a few Saturdays ago. As you can see, it has been a very thorough process. Ted is only doing this after a great deal of thought, discussions and prayer.

Also, after a great deal of thought, discussion and prayer, Ted has decided to take the name "Augustine" as his Confirmation name. The reason for this is that he read "The Confessions" when he was in college and because of his association with a parish who is under the patronage of St. Augustine he decided it was a good fit.

We congratulate Ted. We welcome him in the Catholic Church as well as a parishioner here at St. Augustine Parish. Thank you Ted. You are an inspiration to us. Be assured of our prayers and support.
