A Biographical Sketch of an Augustinian Saint.......

Saint Monica, Mother of Augustine ◆ May 4th

Saint Monica (331?-387) was the mother of Saint Augustine. Born in Tagaste (now known as Souk Ahras in Algeria) in either 331 or 332, Monica was raised in a Christian family.

She married Patricius, a pagan who served on the City Council of Tagaste. Augustine was the couple's eldest son. In the Confessions, Augustine says that she married young, and was a good and patient wife who was generous to her husband. He further notes that Monica had a cordial relationship with her mother-in-law, and was a peacemaker.

Monica was a good mother, but Augustine, as a young man, did not follow her example of Christian faith. Monica prayed continually for her son, as well as for her husband. Both Patricius and Augustine did eventually become followers of Christ.

Augustine credited Monica with planting the seeds of faith in his heart. He called his conversion a return to the faith which had been instilled in him as a child. When Augustine and his friends would get together for philosophical discussions, Augustine would invite his mother to join them. Her wise comments helped nurture the faith that had begun to grow in Augustine's heart.

The conversion of Augustine, whose earlier ways had caused many tears, brought particular joy to Monica. She was present at his baptism. On her way back to Africa with Augustine, she died at Ostia, near Rome, probably sometime in October, 387. Her remains are at the Church of Saint Augustine, Rome.

A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

On the front page of this bulletin you will see a picture of our current Parish Pastoral Council (PPC). It was taken last Saturday morning at a special PPC meeting. It gives me an opportunity to inform you of the importance and the role of the Council and to thank them for the service they provide the parish.

The purpose of the PPC is to advise me on the pastoral needs of the parish. When I first came to the parish almost three years ago, the Council and I reflected on Pope Francis' exhortation The Joy of the Gospel in order to help develop a Pastoral Plan. After a number of months of discussing the exhortation, the Council outlined a plan entitled, *Creating a Community of Involvement and Evangelization*.

This plan included:

- 1) The desire to have a new parish service outreach. Consequently, our service to the Gift of Life Family Guest House evolved in which now about 30 parishioners are involved.
- 2) The desire to have more liturgical ministers. Consequently, we have about 55 new liturgical ministers: Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Lectors, and music ministers.
- 3) The desire for more social opportunities for our young adults. Consequently, we now have a social once a month after the 7:00 PM Mass at which about 40 young adults usually attend.
- 4) The desire to be more innovative in communicating with our parishioners. Consequently, the parish now has an excellent website and there is an active committee pursuing the possibilities of the use of other social media today.
- 5) The desire to have more networking in the parish. Consequently, a plan has been developed to have a volunteer for volunteers. This person will coordinate a volunteer fair (tentatively scheduled for October 7th) so that our parishioners will have an opportunity to know what are possible volunteer opportunities outside the parish as well as needs within the parish to volunteer

At our monthly meetings we get updates on the development of these and other initiatives. There is an opportunity for me to give the Council members updates of what is going on in the parish, and the opportunity for Council members to inform me what they hear that I might not hear.

As you can imagine from the aforementioned, our monthly meetings are very agenda oriented. Last Saturday morning was an opportunity for the Council to gather not so much with a business agenda as an opportunity to get to know each other better as individuals. Each person had the opportunity to share who he or she is and what was going on in each of their lives. It was agreed by the 13 participants that it was a very valuable experience to get to know each other better.

As we finished, we agreed that we want to hear more from parishioners about what questions you have, what has helped you in your spiritual journey and what needs you have on this journey. We hope to spend time in the future to develop this initiative.

Time is precious and a rare commodity for all of us. So, you can appreciate, as I can, the generosity of these men and women to give up their Saturday morning on a day which happened to be a beautiful Spring weather day.

In a few months we will be accepting nominations for the Parish Pastoral Council. Maybe you might consider serving the parish as these generous men and women have and for whom I am very grateful.
