

A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

This Sunday, the 4th Sunday of Easter, is traditionally referred to as "Good Shepherd Sunday." This is the 60th anniversary of what also is called "World Day of Prayer for Vocations."

In the Easter Season, the Church asks us to bring attention to Vocations in the midst of many other celebrations, the celebration of the Resurrection, the celebration of many joining our faith community, some by baptism and others by making a profession of faith to the Catholic Church.

We celebrate all vocations to the General Priesthood of Christ which took place at our baptism when we were called to hear God's Word and to proclaim it

We thank God for the many ways we have celebrated our priesthood: married life, single life, religious life and ministerial priesthood.

I am grateful for the calling I have to the ministerial priesthood of Jesus. After many prayers of "Lord, let me know what you want me to do in my life," I decided in my senior year of college to join the Augustinians and also to be a priest. I give thanks that for close to 52 years God has used me to be so intrinsically involved in the lives of others, especially at very significant times.

Although we are celebrating all vocations this Sunday, I ask you to think of someone whom you think would be a good priest and let the person know that you think that way. I am speaking here about the ministerial priesthood in particular because for so many varied reasons there is a scarcity of ordained priests. God may be using you in your vocation to sow the seed and to give the encouragement to someone to consider their vocation as an ordained priest.

In whatever way of life, we are, hopefully we all can see that the Lord wants to use us. It may be our varied talents, our feet, our hands, our voices that the Lord is using to help others in their relationship with God and consequently their salvation.


Thank you for living out your baptism, your vocation, whatever it is, as it is not easy in the secular society in which we live.


