A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

We often have heard the expression when someone dies that that person was "a pillar of the Church." In the death of Lita Manguba last Tuesday evening, July 28th, we came to a better understanding of that expression. After surviving a stroke in 2005, Lita made a commitment to devote herself to St. Augustine Parish. She certainly fulfilled that promise to God. This was experienced in many ways, but especially in the time and energy she devoted to parish fundraisers and particularly to the celebration of the Sinulog. She became a pillar of the parish as we depended on her for so many things, as we depend on a pillar for a building. To say there will be a void without Lita is an understatement. We thank God for all the good she did and we pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit that all of that good will be able to continue. There is a great deal of activity going on with our physical plant. Repairs to the façade of the church as well the painting of the church outside window frames have begun. Weather has been a challenge but progress is being made on both counts. In this process some leaks in the church have been attended to. They passed the test of the storm we experienced last Tuesday, as did the two skylights in the sanctuary of the church which were recently repaired. A company has begun to assess what the cost will be to restore the 8 paintings of St. Augustine's life which are in the balconies of the church. We are able to respond to all these needs because of the generosity of so many of you to our Capital Campaign. Work also has begun to install the equipment that will allow us to automatically livestream Masses, funerals, weddings, baptisms and hopefully some other parish activities.

This weekend we hear the familiar Gospel story of Jesus calming the waves in the storm. Saint Augustine says, "think of the world and this age as the sea, the gale force wind, and a great storm." He says, we can "experience storms in wars, riots, famine, epidemics and when private disasters happen in our lives." You would almost think St. Augustine was sharing these thoughts today. Wars, riots, famine, epidemics, and private disasters are with us today as they were 1600 years ago when Augustine shared his reflections on this Gospel. May we call on Jesus in the storms of our lives today, and keep our eyes on him, less we sink.
