





A word from Fr. Bill...

"Viva Santo Niño! Pit Señor!"

Dear Parishioners:

We welcome Bishop Timothy C. Senior, former Auxiliary Bishop here in Philadelphia and newly installed Bishop of the Diocese of Harrisburg, to St. Augustine Parish this weekend as we celebrate the Sinulog. We welcome our Augustinian Provincial, Fr. Rob Hagan, OSA and all of our visitors from close by as well as from other states. It is wonderful to have all of you with us as we honor the Child Jesus at the National Shrine of Santo Niño.

As we do, we honor all of the members of our Filipino community here in the parish. We are so grateful to them for so many reasons. The first and foremost is the parish probably would not be in existence today if at the invitation of Fr. Walt Quinn, OSA, if the Parish had not become the National Shrine of Santo Niño. We also are very grateful to them as the members of the Filipino community are an inspiration in living our faith. That is a true gift to all of us.

On another topic, August 28th is the Feast of St. Augustine. We will celebrate his feast here in the parish under his patronage on Sunday, August 27. We will have a relic of St. Augustine which can be venerated after all the Masses.

Also, next Sunday we will reinstate the possibility at all the Masses of receiving the Precious Blood of Jesus from the chalice. This has been an option in this parish for many years and then the option was suspended at the beginning of Covid. The Archdiocese gave permission for this to be reinstated as of last November, the First Sunday of Advent. I did not want to do this immediately. It was discussed by our parish staff as well at two of our Parish Pastoral Council meetings and I met last Monday evening on Zoom with over 20 of our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. It is to be made very clear that it is optional to receive from the chalice. One totally receives the Body and Blood of Christ when one receives the host. But as the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "the sign of communion is more complete when given under both kinds since in that form the sign of the Eucharistic meal appears more clearly." (1390)

If one chooses to take advantage of this option, after you receive the host, approach the Eucharistic Minister, make a sign of reverence, the chalice will be handed to you, take a sip of the Precious Blood and the Minister then will wipe with a purificator the place on the chalice where you received the Precious Blood. Again, this is an option as it always has been.

Santo Niño, pray for us.
