


National Shrine of Santo Niño de Cebú

A Biographical Sketch of an Augustinian Saint....

Saint Augustine, Bishop & Doctor ◆ August 28th

The life span of Saint Augustine (354-430) covered a time of crisis and change. The Roman Empire was slowly disintegrating under the invasions of the surrounding peoples. On August 28 Hippo was already under siege. So while Augustine lay dying, this drama of events was intensely alive, and although his mind was now fixed on God, he could not but have been a co-sufferer with his people in their plight. From the time of his priestly ordination (391) and especially since he became bishop (395), his people had been one with him in seeking God's glory through the service of their Church, while one of his greatest aspirations was the promotion of unity in the whole Church. Wishing to live this unity more clearly himself, he founded religious communities. These he saw as centers and symbols of his ideal. Augustine is now dead, but as Saint Possidius said, he still lives on gloriously in the books he left to posterity.

A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

In January 2016, the Parish Finance Commission of St. Augustine recommended to me that we as a parish conduct a capital campaign. Given we are able to pay our bills each week, the need for a campaign may not be obvious. However, as stewards of this historic sacred place, we must consider completing major capital improvements, establishing a "Preservation Account" for the church building, and providing long-term funding for the pastoral needs of the parish.

Maintaining the rich history of our parish and the value of the artwork in the church made it clear we needed to move in this direction. We obtained a grant and hired professional companies to complete two studies: an engineering assessment of the parish (i.e. what needs to be done to the facilities and how much it will cost) and a feasibility study, which determines how much money the parish can reasonably raise.

The feasibility study indicated we can raise \$750,000 from three sources: parishioners, individuals and businesses in the community, and grants from foundations. Some of the capital improvements a campaign will allow us to accomplish include:

- Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant bathrooms in the church and in Carr Hall
- Replacement windows in the Women of Hope facility
- Façade work for the church building
- Assessment of artwork restoration
- Repair to the crucifixion picture in the sanctuary
- Upgrades to the fire alarm system in the church
- An automatic door opener in the church
- Restoration of the pews and kneelers in the church
- Conversion of the heating system in "the 259 Lawrence Street building"
- Replacement of steeple louvers
- Establishment of the preservation fund and funds for the mission of the parish (as mentioned above)

Following completion of the engineering assessment and feasibility study, the Parish Finance Commission recommended we hire national nonprofit Partners for Sacred Places (Partners) to facilitate this capital campaign fundraising process. Partners has a wonderful reputation and a depth of experience helping numerous religious communities throughout the country with similar projects. They have helped us tremendously to get to where we are right now. You can learn more about Partners on their website: www.sacredplaces.org.

I am happy to announce that Gerry and Kathy Rigby have accepted my invitation to chair our capital campaign. I am further happy to announce that Fr. Peter Donahue, OSA, the President of Villanova University, has accepted my invitation to co-chair the campaign.

As you can see, a great deal has been accomplished in the past year - and a great deal more must still be accomplished. To assure a successful capital campaign, we are establishing a full steering committee and several supportive task forces to help with communication, social media, developing a promotional video, contacting current and former parishioners, contacting community leaders, etc.

We need as many parishioners as possible to share their time, talents, and treasure. This is your parish, and we need the involvement of as many parishioners as possible to ensure it is here for many years to come. Our success hinges on the capital campaign being a true community effort, and I sincerely urge everyone to volunteer for a task force. Please sign up using the sheets in the back of the church.
