Dear Parishioners:

Last Saturday evening we experienced one of the highlights of our parish year, the parish's Pre-Christmas concert. It appropriately was entitled "A Light Shines."

I say appropriately because it is truly A Light Shining for the Church to see so many parishioners, young and older, various ethnic backgrounds, long term parishioners and new parishioners come together sharing their time and talents for the betterment of the entire community.

First, it is "a light" to see about 40 men and women share their precious time and musical talent. Time and talent are both gifts and are not to be buried. These men and women have been rehearsing for many long hours since September so that we all could have a more prayerful Advent and Christmas season.

It was literally A Light Shining in seeing how our sanctuary was lit thanks to Jacob Marquart, O.F.S. This environment certainly enhanced the atmosphere for a prayerful evening.

We experienced A Light Shining as many, many parishioners joined us immediately after the concert for a social in Carr Hall. This was the result of many people bringing food, preparing food, and taking care of all the logistics for such a large crowd to gather. Kudos also go to those who cleaned up so generously and selflessly. This is often a thankless task for which many do not sign up. We were blessed with the men and women who so pleasantly did this.

Most significantly we experienced A Light Shining thru our Director of Music, Kim Barasso. Over the past ten weeks Kim has facilitated the rehearsals of two choirs, individually and at times together. He and members of the choirs oversaw all the details that are necessary to make such a beautiful event go smoothly. We are blessed to have Kim for four Masses fifty-two weeks a year, Holy Days and special events like we experienced last Saturday.

Lastly, we experienced A Light Shining in the very large crowd who was with us at the concert. It is probably the largest crowd we have had for this concert. You could sense the light shining in the eyes, the smiles, and the words of appreciation of those who were there.

I started by saying that the Pre-Christmas Concert is one of the highlights of our parish year. This is precisely because it is an opportunity for the entire parish to come together in worship, service, and to enjoy each other's company. It is truly a community with its Light Shining.

A Biographical Sketch of an Augustinian Saint...

Blessed James of Viterbo, Bishop • December 12th

James was born in Viterbo (Italy) around the year 1255. He studies in Paris under the notable Augustinian, Giles of Rome, and later taught in



Paris and Naples. In 1302 he was ordained bishop of Benevento, but on December 12th the same year was transferred to Naples. He wrote important works in which his love for the Church and for the doctrine of Saint Augustine shines out as it did in his life-style. He died in Naples toward the end of 1307 or the beginning of 1308. Pope Pius X confirmed his cult in 1911.
