A word from Fr. Bill....



Dear Parishioners:

We are receiving many calls asking about the time of the Masses on Christmas Eve, this coming Thursday evening. There has been a great deal of discussion with a number of people concerning this. There are many variables. Obviously, the major concern is the safety and comfort of all those who will be here.

Usually, we cannot have a Vigil Mass before 4:00 PM. Because of the present circumstances with the pandemic, the Archbishop has relaxed that directive this year and will permit earlier Masses on Christmas Eve. Consequently, at the recommendation of a member of our Parish Pastoral Council, we are adding another Mass (3:30 PM) with the hope this will reduce the number at the 5:30 PM Mass which traditionally has the largest number in attendance. We will continue to have the 5:30 and 8:30 Masses as a number of parishioners have come to these Masses in the past years. There was a great deal of discussion if we should continue to have the 10:30 PM Mass on Christmas Eve. I have decided we should because last year there were 40 people at that Mass. I would like to accommodate as many people as possible. I also hope that with having four Masses on Christmas Eve, the number of attendees will be spread out.

We hear it said over and over that these are unprecedented times. Because of several variables: the increase number of people getting the virus, the fact that by the directive of Archbishop Perez it is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year, the fact that many people understandably do not want to be in a crowd, and the fact that not as many people will be traveling as usual, we have no idea what the attendance at Christmas Eve Masses will be like. At the same time, we would like the numbers to be spread out and we want everyone to be SAFE and comfortable. After considering various options, the bottom line is we are maintaining the times of Christmas Eve Masses that we have had for a number of years, but adding one at 3:30 PM. A lot of thought and discussion has gone into this.

We certainly will have the 10:00 AM Mass on Christmas Day.

It is important to repeat that the Archbishop has removed the obligation to attend Mass on Christmas. He very much encourages the elderly and those who have other physical ailments which would compromise them not to come to Christmas Mass. We will LiveStream all 4 of our Christmas Eve Masses and the one on Christmas Day.

This will be a very different Christmas for all of us. Be assured of my prayers and the prayers of our Augustinian Community and our staff that you have a very blessed and beautiful Christmas.
