A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend we celebrate one of the greatest events that has ever taken place in the history of the world.

What? God became human. God took on our flesh and began to live his humanity like us in all things (got tired, cried, got frustrated, anxious, angry, needed friends, etc.) but never sinned and was always open to do the will of our Heavenly God.

Why? Because salvation had been lost to us and our Heavenly God wanted to restore the possibility for us to spend eternity with Him. So, God gave us Jesus to let us know that we have a loving, forgiving and merciful God. Jesus manifested this over and over.

How? God chose an ordinary woman in a very extraordinary way to become pregnant and give birth to Jesus.

This all sounds like a very basic catechism class, but somehow we become so familiar with it all, we can lose its significance and take it for granted.

In order not to lose its significance, may we do two things this weekend:

- 1.) May we remember that the traditions of Christmas have a religious significance. As we see Christmas lights, may we remember they signify that Jesus is our light. As we give and receive presents, may we remember they are an extension of the greatest gift ever given, Jesus Himself. As we see a star on the top of a tree, may we think of the three wise men who followed the star to see Jesus in Bethlehem and may we be aware that wise men and women still do seek Him today.
- 2.) As we reflect on Mary giving birth to Jesus, may we be open to Jesus being born within us and being born in our environment (family, work, neighborhood, parish) thru us. Both of these things can involve birth pains but both can have incredible and beautiful ramifications.

On behalf of our Augustinian community and our parish community, I wish each of you a marvelous celebration of Jesus' birth.
