



A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

In Sermon 193, St. Augustine makes the following comments concerning today's Christmas Gospel from St. Luke.

"When the gospel was read, we heard the voices of angels announcing to the shepherds that the Lord Jesus Christ was born of a virgin: Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will....... Let us too then say, and say with all the jubilation we can muster – because we aren't announcing his birth to shepherds watching their flocks, but celebrating his birthday with his sheep, let us too say, I repeat, with faithful hearts in loyal voices, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will."

In lots of ways, all of us are shepherds, responsible for the welfare of others, not only physical and psychological, but also the spiritual welfare of others. St. Augustine is saying we also must announce the good news of God's love for us. For whatever reasons, we are often reluctant to outwardly share our faith with others. The shepherds shouted for joy the good news of Jesus being one with us. May we do the same.

Because of the first sin (original sin) —I am going to do it my way, not God's way— we lost the existence of the Garden of Eden. We deal with our own sinfulness, selfishness and its consequences. There is no way we can have the existence of the Garden of Eden restored by ourselves. We don't deserve it. But because of God's infinite love for us and because he wants to be in perfect union with us in paradise, he gave us his son to restore that relationship. Today, we celebrate the beginning of his son's life on earth. Happy birthday, Jesus!

As we see Christmas lights on trees and houses, may we be aware that Jesus was born to bring us from darkness to light. He is our light leading us to the kingdom. As we share gifts, may they remind us of the gift of Jesus to each of us. As we unwrap the gifts, may we unwrap the gift of our heavenly God to us, the gift of Jesus.

As St. Augustine said in his Sermon 193, may we too along with the shepherds, announce the good news of Jesus' birth.

Have a wonderful celebration of Christmas, Christ with us.
