

A Biographical Sketch of an Augustinian Saint.......

Saint Fulgentius, Bishop • January 3rd

Fulgentius was born in 462 of the Gordiani senatorial family at Thelepte in Tunisia. As



a young man he was a procurator, an office in the Vandal administration which included the collection of taxes. Later he felt a call to the religious life and decided to enter after reading Saint Augustine's exposition of Psalm 36. About the year 499 he set out to join the hermits of the Thebaid in Egypt, but arriving in Sicily he changed his mind, when he learned of the influence of monophysitism on Egyptian monks. He visited Rome in 500 and was elected Bishop of Ruspe in 502. He was twice exiled to Sardinia and died at

Ruspe on January 1, 527. As his writings show he was a keen student of Augustinian doctrine, and his form of monasticism clearly follows the mind and way of life of the saint. Indeed he was popularly known as the *pocket Augustine*. He loved the ideal of community life and the actual living of it. Disliking to be away from the fellowship of monks, he founded several monasteries not only in Africa but while in exile. The Order has been celebrating his feast since 1581 on January 3rd.

A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

As one year comes to an end and another year begins, we have the opportunity to thank God for all the wonderful things that happened in our parish in 2017 and ask for God's blessings in 2018.

In 2017 we had the opportunity to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the Filipino community at St. Augustine. It was wonderful to have with us for that occasion the Prior General and Vicar General of the Augustinians, Father Alejandro Moral Antón, OSA and Father Joe Farrell, OSA. 94 persons registered as new parishioners in the parish during 2017. 54 couples celebrated the Sacrament of Marriage in the calendar year of 2017. We had 11 Baptisms in 2017. It is a wonderful thing to be able to say we end the year with basically all of our bills paid. That is largely due to your generosity. In 2017, we saw the innovation of two, "Theology on Taps," one on the topic of "Christian-Muslim Relations" and the second on "Exorcism." We had the first Day of Reflection for married couples on Valentine's weekend with approximately 15 couples participating. In June, there was an article published in the National Catholic Reporter concerning the influence Pope Francis' exhortations have had on our parish. We saw the beginning of a new endeavor called "Renew" with three small groups sharing insights to the Gospels during Advent. Of course one of the highlights of our parish year is the pre-Christmas concert. This is the result of months of preparation by maybe 60 parishioners and guests. There is no doubt that the attendance at this year's concert was the largest ever. We experienced one sad thing during the year and that was the death of Fernando Dacanay, one of the original Filipinos to come to our parish and certainly a backbone of the Filipino community here.

It is extremely important to point out that none of these things could have taken place without the extremely competent staff we have in the parish. I would be lost (literally) without Jacob, Jean, Kim, Bob, and Tim. I had the wonderful guidance and collaboration of the Parish Pastoral Council and Parish Finance Commission with all of the above and more. I am grateful during the past year for the help of Fathers Tony, Paul and Jim. They have given me the opportunity to take a day off, go on retreat and go on vacation.

We ask for God's blessings in 2018. We will have our second Day of Reflection for married couples on February 10th. The theme will be, "Love in Marriage - Growing in Love." We will have our third Theology on Tap on February 11th concerning "End of Life Issues" with Fr. Jim McCartney, OSA of Villanova giving the keynote address and one of our parishioners, Lori Bellizzi, a nurse, and hopefully a doctor sharing their real experiences concerning the topic. We will celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation with six men and women during the Easter Season. Fr. Peter Donahue, OSA, the President of Villanova University will be the presider and homilist at the Summer Sinulog on August 19th. One of the most significant and unique things for which we ask God's blessings in 2018 is our Capital Campaign. After a great deal of work (engineering study, feasibility study, development of a Steering Committee, five tasks forces, a case statement and a video, we are ready to launch. Our goal is \$750,000. This will go to improvements on the property (windows in the Women of Hope building, conversion of the heating system in the Ministries Building, restoration of pews and kneelers in the church, handicap accessible bathrooms in Carr Hall and the church, façade work on the church directed by the city, assessment of needs of our art in the church as well as other things) the development of a preservation account and some funds for ministry. This is a mammoth project for the parish in 2018, but one that will benefit the parish for many years to come.

Please join me in thanking God for His blessings on all of our endeavors in 2017 and asking for His blessings on our endeavors in 2018.
