

A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

About 7 years ago our parish began a ministry at Gift of Life Family House, "Howie's House."

What is Gift of Life? I liken it to a Ronald McDonald House who host families of children at a Children's hospital. Gift of Life is a "home away from home for transplant patients and their families by providing temporary, affordable lodging, and supportive services to those who travel to Philadelphia for transplant-related care."

When do our parishioners go there? We have two teams. One team spearheaded by Jane O'Connor goes on the 2nd Sunday of the month. Our second team spearheaded by Jerry and Rosemary Lorenz goes on the third Tuesday of each month. They meet in the late afternoon with the buffet meal ready to be served to the residents at 6 PM.

What do they do? After planning and shopping for the meal, our parish volunteers meet onsite at Gift of Life to cook the meal together. The team spends about two hours onsite for each meal provided. Volunteers are welcome to help with all aspects; meal planning, grocery shopping and onsite cooking. The Parish provides the financial resources for this ministry via the generous contribution of parishioners to the "Fellowship and Outreach Collection" which takes place on the 3rd Sunday of each month.

How do the residents and their families respond to the ministry of our parishioners? After a day at a hospital, a doctor's office or doing physical therapy, they are extremely grateful for a warm hot, home cooked meal. They send a thank you note after each dinner, signed by all who participated in the meal. You will find one this weekend in the back of the church.

How do our parishioners feel about their ministry? Here are a few reflections of our parishioners: "The people who are there are very sick, but they are cheerful and grateful. This is a model for us."

"It is enjoyable to learn from each other. It is a very enjoyable experience."

"It is a gift to feed people when they are hungry, and especially when they are in our neighborhood."

"It is very satisfying. Sometimes I don't feel like going, but when I get there, I get rejuvenated. It is very rewarding."

"Some of the guests there express how grateful they are to have vegetables, salad and potatoes."

"I don't always feel like going, but I am always very glad I did. It is great to interact with our own parishioners--especially such a cross section of our parish, in particular people I don't see that often and people I see in church, but didn't really know."

"It helps keep the spirituality going of what happens at Mass."

How does the staff at Gift of Life respond to our parish volunteers? A few years ago, Alicia Pettine from Gift of Life said, "Both the Sunday and Tuesday groups have really made this program seamless and we look forward to the days they come in because we don't have to worry about having a successful (and innovative) dinner."

Where is Gift of Life? One of the things which I really appreciate about this ministry is that it is within the geographic boundaries of our parish, 4th and Callowhill Streets.

I take this opportunity to thank Jane O'Connor, Rosemary and Jerry Lorenz for their leadership in this ministry and all the volunteers who represent us so well and who so selflessly serve our brothers and sisters in need.

Someone (Jerry Lorenz at the 9, Ruth and Ferdi Luyun at the 11, and Bob Schuck at the 7) will be speaking at the Masses this weekend about this outreach. If you are interested in volunteering to help at Gift of Life, there will be an opportunity to sign up in the back of the church.
