A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

I hope each of you had a wonderful celebration of Jesus' birth. Hopefully, all the busyness of presents, Christmas trees, lights, traveling, etc. were signs of our joy that Jesus took on our flesh and become one with us.

As always, I am grateful for all who made the celebration in the parish go so smoothly. First and foremost, I am grateful to my Augustinian brothers, Fathers Jim, Paul and Rich for filling in for me in general and specifically for presiding at the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses. I am grateful for Rey Borres, Brother Jack Stagliano, OSA, Adam Klukiewski and all who made the church look so festive for the great celebration of God's love. As always, the music incredibly enhanced our celebration. Thank you, Kim, our choir members and cantors.

This Sunday is the Feast of the Holy Family. The family was holy because Jesus, Mary and Joseph were each open to do what God was calling them to do, even if they didn't totally understand. We have heard it said that each family is a small Church community. We have heard it said that each family is the nucleus of our society. The weakness and strength of each family has tremendous effects on many ramifications of our lives. What are the strengths in my family? Can I list them? May we literally give thanks to God for those strengths and be conscious to reinforce them. What are the weaknesses in my family? Can I list them? Does my family ever pray together? The family that prays together stays together. Are there any family members with whom I am alienated? If yes, how does that affect my life and the life of others? What am I willing to do about it?

On Monday, we celebrate the Feast of Mary, the Mother of God. It is so important for me to reflect on Mary's unequivocal "yes" to respond to God's will even when it did not make sense. Mary questioned how God was using her but in the midst of that questioning said "yes" to whatever God's will was. God wants to use each of us in the plan of salvation. May this feast prompt us to reflect on how God wants to use me and how open I am to it, even when I may not understand.

Finally, I continue to thank you for your prayers, concerns, and contacts of best wishes during my stay at Magee Rehab where I have been for three weeks. I have not had any pain or fever the entire time but I am still not able to do a lot of things on my own, including walking. I receive physical, occupational and speech therapy almost each day, including Christmas Day. There is definite progress, especially in walking with a walker and balance. I had another CT scan this past week and the images of the brain show definite improvement from a few weeks ago. (Thank goodness they continue to find a brain.) As you read this, I should be at the Augustinian Health Care Facility at Villanova for continued therapy. I do not know how long that stay will be, but probably until I can walk more independently which I do not anticipate will be all that long.

I pray that as we begin a new year that 2024 will be a wonderful year for the parish and for each of us.
