# A word from Fr. Bill....

#### Dear Parishioners:

In seven weeks we are all going to be asked at the Easter liturgies to renew our baptismal promises. We are going to be asked if we believe in the three persons of the Trinity. We are going to be asked if we reject sin and if we refuse to be mastered by sin. In forty-four years as a priest I have never heard anyone say "no" to any of these questions. But, I have to say I wonder if the answers are mechanical or if there has been some thought and preparation that have gone into the answers.

As you know, Lent begins this Wednesday, Ash Wednesday. The purpose of Lent is for us to prepare with prayer, fasting and almsgiving to renew our baptismal promises.

There are many resources to help us to be authentic in answering the questions posed to us at Easter.

- Celebrate the Eucharist (12:05 PM and 7:00 PM) on Ash Wednesday, beginning this season prayerfully. Receive ashes on Wednesday and very proudly wearing them to acknowledge our sinfulness, and publicly stating we are going to turn from our sins; also to make the effort to celebrate Mass during the week during Lent.
- Taking advantage of the beautiful Sacrament of Penance, experiencing the mercy of our God. In addition to being available at the regular
  time on Saturdays from 4:30 PM to 5:00 PM, we will be available for confessions during Lent after the 11:00 AM and 7:00 PM Masses on
  Sundays.
- Joining the Universal Church in abstaining from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent as well as fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- Participating in the "Stations of the Cross" on Fridays at 7:00 PM.
- Using the two resources in the back of the church (Daily Reflections for Lent, Not by Bread Alone and A Mission of Mercy) for guidance and support in prayer. They provide suggested scripture passages and reflections for each day of Lent.
- Donating the money, we might save from "giving something up" to a charitable cause.
- Making it a point to not only fast from ice cream, chocolates, etc. but more importantly to fast from un-charitableness, bad language, looking at pornography, etc.
- Finding a way to volunteer my time and talents for someone less fortunate.
- Participating in "Operation Rice Bowl." These contributions support Catholic Relief Services' projects around the globe including 25% of the funds being used to purchase food for cupboards and soup kitchens here in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.
- Participating in a Tuesday evening (2/26, 2/23, 3/1, 3/8, 3/15 7:00 PM-9:00 PM) Lenten discussion group which will use as its basis of discussion Henri Nouwen's book, The Return of the Prodigal Son. The group will meet in the small chapel next to the sanctuary in the church.

None of these things is an end in themselves. They are all a means to help us focus on Jesus and to be better prepared to genuinely answer very publicly the questions we will be asked at Easter about believing in God and about rejecting sin, and refusing to be mastered by sin.

Have a great week and a great beginning of Lent.
