A word from Fr. Bíll...

Dear Parishioners:

As you know, this Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. This is the time for us to prepare to renew our baptism promises. At every Mass on Easter, every Catholic in the world will be asked if we reject sin, the glamour of evil, if we refuse to be mastered by sin, if we believe in God, Jesus Christ, the Holy Catholic Church, and the Resurrection, etc. The Resurrection which we celebrate on Easter is the central ministry of our faith. St. Paul says if Jesus did not rise from the dead, our faith is in vain. In over 50 years as a priest, I have never heard anyone say "no" to any of those questions. I have to admit, however, that I wonder at times if we truly reflect on what we are saying or are we just responding mechanically.

It is important to prepare well to answer these questions. As a parish, we want to provide resources to help you to be well prepared to respond "yes" to these questions.

We begin that preparation at our two Masses at 12:05 pm and 7:00 pm on Ash Wednesday. This is when we hear the words "Turn from your sins and believe in the Gospel." Lent is a time to help us to turn from our sins and believe the good news.

We will also receive a pin with the image of ashes on the form of a Cross. We encourage you to wear this pin during Lent to remind you that for which you are preparing and for it to be a sign to others that you are preparing to renew your baptism promises.


