



A word from Fr. Bíll...

Dear Parishioners:

Believe it or not, Lent is here. It begins this Wednesday, Ash Wednesday, March 2nd. For we who are Christians, this is a very significant season in the liturgical year. Why? Anytime we do something significant, there is always preparation involved, e.g., preparing for a wedding, a vacation, guests to visit, a trip, celebrating a holiday, etc.

An essential aspect of Lent is to prepare to renew our baptism promises at Easter. This goes to the core of the history of Lent. At one time in the Church's history, only adults were baptized. Catechumens would prepare for a significant period of time for their baptism and very intensely prepare by prayer, fasting and abstinence during the last 40 days before Easter. As time went on, it became the practice to baptize infants. So, the question surfaced what would happen to those 40 days of intense preparation for baptism. Since we are celebrating new life as we celebrate the Resurrection, it was decided to keep baptism intimately related to Easter and have the baptized renew their baptism promises at Easter.

Consequently, each Easter we are asked if we reject sin, the glamour of evil, refuse to be mastered by sin and we are asked if we believe in God, Jesus Christ, the Holy Catholic Church, the Resurrection, etc.

What are some ways in the parish we can prepare by prayer, fasting and abstinence to celebrate the new life that Jesus gives us thru his resurrection as well as to prepare to renew our baptism promises?

On Ash Wednesday, ashes will be distributed within the 12:05 PM and 7:00 PM Masses. This year because of the pandemic, as we did last year, we will avoid skin to skin contact and we will distribute ashes by using a different cotton squab for each person.

#### There are various ways to incorporate prayer into our Lenten journey:

A) Join us each Tuesday of Lent for a discussion on the Liturgy of the Eucharist. In my letter in the bulletin last weekend I spoke about this series and we enclosed a flyer outlining the six weeks as well as the comments of those who participated in the Advent discussions on the Liturgy of the Word. You will find the information again within this bulletin. You also will find it on our parish website. One needs to register for each session. You can do that by clicking on the provide registration links. Please share this flyer with family and friends. It is an excellent way of evangelizing.

**B)** Join members of our parish on Thursday evenings at 7 PM for the discussion of the scripture passages for the upcoming Sunday. These also are on Zoom. You will find the Zoom number on our parish website and on the front cover of this bulletin.

C) Join us by Zoom on Fridays at 7:00 PM for the Stations of the Cross. You will find this Zoom number also on our parish website and in the bulletin.

**D)** In the back of the church you will find four resources to enrich your prayer life during Lent: The first is entitled *Understanding Lent*. The second is entitled *Turn to God*, which has reflections on the readings for each of the days of Lent. The third is entitled *Growing in Friendship with Christ* which has reflections from Pope Francis, Fr. Henri Nouwen, and Mother Teresa. The fourth is entitled *Hope for Renewal* which contains a daily Lenten reflection from Pope Francis and a question for us to ponder.

If you are not able to come to church, and would like us to provide you with any of these pamphlets, please let us know.

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A word from Fr. Bíll...

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**E)** Take advantage of celebrating the Sacrament of Penance which we make available after each of our Sunday Masses or by making arrangements for a specific time. Also there are a number of local churches which make this sacrament available on weekdays: St. Rita Shrine, St. John Neumann Shrine and the Cathedral of St. Peter and Paul. In the back of the church in the book rack there is a flyer with all this information.

**F)** If you are not able to join us for Mass in person, please join us virtually. All of our Sunday Masses (9:00 AM, 11:00 AM and 7:00 PM) and the 12:05 PM weekday Masses are LiveStreamed. Please see the homepage of our parish website for the link to connect.

We can prepare for Easter and the renewal of our baptism promises by fasting and and almsgiving by participating in Operation Rice Bowl. To give something up is a very valuable aspect of spirituality but fasting and abstaining are not ends in themselves but a means to an end. The idea of Operation Rice Bowl is to donate the money I would have used for which I am fasting and/or abstaining (e.g. beer, liquor, chocolate, ice cream, "whatever"), so that others who do not have enough food can eat. You will find the Rice Bowls in the back of the church. If you are not able to get to church to pick up a Rice Bowl and would like one, please let us know and we will get one to you or just create your own container and forward the money to us at the end of Lent.

Just as there is a value in fasting and abstaining (giving something up), there is a value of doing something positive which I might not normally do, e.g. donate some time in a charitable way to a an important cause.

As in other years, we will be distributing a pin with the symbol of a cross formed by ashes. In the early days of the Church, the faithful wore ashes for 40 days. While that is not feasible today, we encourage you to wear the pin throughout Lent as a visible sign of being a Christian preparing for Easter.

Even though these continue to be challenging days during the pandemic, we can be creative in our prayer, fasting and almsgiving as we prepare to celebrate the fact that Jesus in destroying death and restoring life has given us the possibility of eternal life. And we can be creative to prepare to renew our baptism promises and publicly proclaim that we reject sin the glamour of evil, refuse to be mastered by sin and that we believe in God, Jesus Christ, the Holy Catholic Church, the Resurrection and eternal life.


