A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

As you very well know, Pope Francis has declared this year as a "Jubilee Year of Mercy." Almost every time Pope Francis speaks these days he talks about God's mercy for us and how we should imitate that mercy with each other.

Since December 8th, when "The Year of Mercy" began, I have been extremely struck by how many times the word "mercy" is mentioned in the Scriptures, both in the First Testament and in the New Testament as well as in the Mass. I would like to share a number of them with you.

"Whoever conceals his transgressions will not prosper, but the one who confesses and forsakes them will obtain **mercy**." *Proverbs* 28:13

"The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end." Lamentations 3:22-23

"The Lord is good to all, and his tender mercies are over all his works." Psalm 145:9

"Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful." Luke 6:36

"Blessed are the **merciful**, for they shall receive **mercy**." *Matthew 5:7*

"Go and learn what this means, 'I desire **mercy**, and not sacrifice.' For I came not to call the righteous, but sinners." *Matthew 9:13*

"For judgement is without mercy to the one who has shown no mercy. Mercy triumphs over judgement." James 2:13

"Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive **mercy** and find grace to help in time of need." *Hebrews 4:16*

"Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his **mercy** he saved us by the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit," *Titus 3:5*

In the beginning of Mass we pray, "Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy....."

In the Collect (Opening Prayer) this weekend we begin by saying "O God, author of every **mercy**..." And we end the same prayer this weekend by saying, "we...may always be lifted up by your **mercy**."

Our response in the Responsorial Psalm this weekend is, "The Lord is kind and merciful."

We begin Eucharistic Prayer 1 by saying, "To you, therefore, most merciful Father...."

The word "mercy" appears many, many more times in both the Scriptures and in the Mass. This really has caught my attention in recent months. As Pope Francis is pointing out, God is certainly giving us a strong message about mercy.

During this week may we think, reflect and be grateful for the mercy which our Heavenly God extends to us. May we imitate that same mercy to someone(s) this week.
