



A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

On Sunday, we celebrate one of our major parish events of the year, the Winter Sinulog Festival. As you know, this is celebrated in the Philippines on the third Sunday of January with great solemnity, including processions and dancing in the streets. Because of January weather here we transfer the celebration with the great solemnity to the 3rd Sunday of August. We do, however, have a scaled down celebration on the 3rd Sunday of January.

I always like to take this opportunity to thank our Filipino community for being such an essential part of St. Augustine Parish. I know I have said it many times, but it is worth repeating, if Fr. Walt Quinn in 1992 had not accepted the invitation that St. Augustine Parish be the National Shrine for Santo Niño, it is very possible the parish would not be in existence today. Around that time there were about 120 registered families and 356 registered parishioners. Today, there are approximately 720 registered families and 1347 registered parishioners. The parish today has a great deal of activity with a diversity of cultures and ages. But it is not a stretch to say this very likely would not be the case if it were not for the Filipino Community. So, it is important for us this weekend to be in sync with our brothers and sisters in the Philippines and to celebrate the Winter Sinulog with great festivity.

This past Monday, we celebrated the Feast of the Baptism of Jesus, Santo Niño, Little Child. In the Gospel this weekend, that little child is all grown up and John the Baptist points him out as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. The little child who was powerless and homeless has become aware of his mission from our Heavenly God, to take away the sin of the world.

Hopefully, we have grown from being little children to realize the mission our heavenly God has for each of us.

We have celebrated the Advent and Christmas Seasons. Now, we move back into Ordinary Time where we follow the public ministry of the one who once was a little child, Santo Niño.
