



Please join us at the **Philadelphia March For Life, Saturday, January 23, 2021** sponsored by the Archdiocesan Office for Life and Family, the Pro-Life Union of Greater Philadelphia and many other organizations. The event will include a 9AM Mass at the Cathedral celebrated by Archbishop Nelson Perez, followed by a march to the Philadelphia Women's Center at 777 Appletree St. and a closing rally at Independence Mall from 12 to 1 p.m. This commemorates the 47th anniversary of Roe v. A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend, the third Sunday of January, is one of the highlights of our parish year. We celebrate the Sinulog, the feast of Santo Niño, the patron of the Philippines. We in this parish, also celebrate it on the third Sunday of August because August is much more conducive to celebrating on the streets.

As we celebrate the Sinulog this weekend, we do so keeping in mind the directives concerning the coronavirus. We will not have the procession of everyone around the church. Instead of this procession, there will be one person who will bring the Santo Niño image around the church, stopping at 5 places while we say the five decades of the rosary. We will follow the directives of wearing masks and social distancing, staying six feet from each other. Because there will not be a luncheon after Mass, each person will receive a paper bag lunch to take home. We ask everyone to leave the church immediately after Mass and not to congregate in groups, respecting the personal space of each other.

As we celebrate the feast this weekend and we recall that we are the National Shrine of Santo Niño, it gives me the opportunity to thank our local Filipino community for who they are for us.

We literally may not be a parish today if it were not for the Filipino community. I understand the parish was struggling a great deal to stay open in 1992 when representatives of the Filipino community asked Fr. Walt Quinn, OSA, the pastor at the time, if our parish could be the home of Santo Niño. Thank goodness he said "yes." Not long after that the parish church received about two million dollars of damage from a hurricane. It was members of the Filipino community who volunteered innumerable hours to help with the cleanup of this catastrophe. I heard this past week that Fr. Quinn said that in one week after the Filipinos came to the parish there was a choir and there were lectors. This is indicative of the new life that the parish received.

I have experienced this sense of community, prayer and service of the Filipino community as pastor over the past seven years, and in particular in the past week. Two members of the Filipino community died recently, Dr. Michael DeCastro and Amada Robertson. There were novenas for nine nights on Zoom for both of them. There were from 25 to 75 persons praying each of the nine nights. May we not forget these are busy people with jobs and families. This is a tremendous testament of the prayerful devotedness of the Filipino community. Last Sunday, under the coordination of Rey Borres, at least 20 members of the Filipino community stayed after the 11:00 AM Mass to take down the Christmas decorations. This was done in a relatively short period of time very efficiently with love and laughter. This is a tremendous testament to the sense of service that the Filipino community has to our parish. It should be noted that none of the members of Filipino community live within or very near our parish boundaries. They come from New Jersey, Upper Darby, Horsham, Blue Bell, Northeast Philadelphia, Delaware and other areas. This is another testament of their devotedness to our parish.

This weekend, we celebrate approximately the 29th celebration of the Sinulog here at St. Augustine Parish. We thank the Child Jesus, Santo Niño, for all the blessings that this parish has received.

Have a wonderful celebration of the Sinulog and a SAFE week.
