A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

As we gather this weekend to hear God's word and celebrate the Eucharist, we are in the midst of celebrating Christian Unity Week.

I remember when I was a child we were told not to play with children from public schools. We were not allowed to join the YMCA because we were contributing to a non-Catholic Christian organization.

Thank goodness we've come a long way from some of those attitudes. It's true, however, that there are still divisions among Christian religions and this week is an opportunity for us to pray, think and act in ways that may help bring about greater Christian unity.

The night before Jesus died, at the Last Supper, he offered a prayer of unity, "Father may they all be one as you and I are one." What a wonderful model of unity, the unity of our heavenly Father and his Son. Jesus is praying that all of us may fulfill our own different roles in the same sense of unity. Jesus prayed for that unity. May we also pray for it.

Some of the issues that brought about the reformation 500 years ago are not the same issues today, e.g. the place of indulgences, the place of Scripture in our lives, and the way in which justification takes place for salvation. There are, however, issues today that divide us. As Catholics we believe the Pope is the successor of St. Peter. We believe Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist which is not the belief of many Protestant denominations. You and I are not going to solve the doctrinal differences. We can, however, try to become more educated and learn about them. We need to recognize there are more things we have in common with other Christian religions than what separates us.

We can be involved in non-doctrinal changes. We can be open to and appreciate the many things that we have in common with other Christian religions. We certainly have more in common than what separates us. We believe that Jesus is the Messiah and the savior of the world. We believe in basic teachings of Jesus. We as Catholics have come to a greater appreciation of Scripture. We work side-by-side with many of our Protestant brothers and sisters in soup kitchens, etc.

If we truly want to have a greater sense of unity, you and I need to be aware of the need and be willing to pray for that unity, learn more about the questions, and act in ways we can help unify and not divide us.

Thank goodness we no longer have the fear of playing with children in public schools or associating with adults of another religion. Thank goodness we can be members of the YMCA and YWCA. (The YMCA even gave me a clergy discount for many years.) We have made progress but more progress still needs to be made.

May this week, Christian Unity Week, be an opportunity for us to reflect on this topic and do our part to help bring about greater Christian unity.
