A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

Considering all the adaptations that needed to be addressed because of the coronavirus, our Sinulog celebration last Sunday went very smoothly. One alternative could have been not to have the celebration at all because of all the precautions that were needed. Thank goodness (more appropriately, thank God) that we decided to have it and that we had a wonderful celebration.

I am very grateful for the cooperation of all those attending, especially with adhering to the directives of wearing masks and social distancing. I am extremely grateful for all those who had any part in the preparation: those in the music ministry, the liturgical ministers, those preparing the church and decorations, those preparing the lunches to go, Jacob Marquart, O.F.S. who facilitated the LiveStreaming of the Mass, and especially Rey Borres who coordinated so much of the celebration.

After the Mass, I received several emails from friends who watched the Mass virtually. Bill who watched it in California said, "I had never been aware of this uniquely Filipino feast of the baby Jesus. Impressive. The faith of your congregation is really powerful, as evidenced by the attendance. Not words...deeds. I'm admittedly in a bit of awe. Admirable." Thank you, Bill. I think you put into words what we all felt. Mary Lou who watched it in Maryland said, "Thanks for sharing this festival with us! You shared the feast with a lot of us who probably "knew" about it but hadn't experienced it." What Mary Lou says gives credence to the expression, "You have to experience it to believe it."

I also received the following email this week: In part what this person said was: "I recently joined the St. Augustine Parish and had the pleasure of attending my first Mass with you on Sunday. It was also my first Sinulog; what a treat! I felt so much warmth and joy from you and all in attendance." What a wonderful welcome and first impression for someone who celebrated the Eucharist with us for the first time.

Dear Fellow Parishioners:

It's hard to believe that, here at St. Augustine, we embarked on our Capital Campaign three years ago! As you may already know, we have reached our goal of \$750,000 in pledges for Phase 1. We are so proud of and grateful to our parishioners, as well as the three Augustinian Provinces of the USA, all of whose generosity and concern became abundantly clear during the campaign. It has been a collective effort and a rewarding experience. We have already been able to complete a number of significant projects, including:

- Church pew restoration & carpet replacement—center aisles complete, sides in process
- Restoration of the crucifixion tableau in the church sanctuary
- Replacement of two skylights in church sanctuary
- Painting of church outside window frames
- Stations of the Cross properly secured
- Repair and repointing of church façade below tower
- Complete renovation of two church bathrooms
- New wheelchair accessible bathroom
- Conversion to LED lighting in church
- Assessment for restoration of 8 lunette paintings in the church of the life of St. Augustine
- Conversion from oil to natural gas heating in 259 Building
- New east and west windows in 251 (Women of Hope) building
- Initiation of preservation account

As you can see, much has been accomplished! But despite our Phase 1 success, there are still some additional repairs and upgrades needed to restore and preserve our magnificent, historic church and buildings. We estimate the remaining costs to be upwards of \$1 million dollars. The tasks that require attention in the near future include:

- Repair and repointing of church tower masonry
- Upgrade to church fire alarm system
- Installation of automatic openers for side door of church
- Louver replacement in church steeple
- Restoration of the 8 lunette paintings in the church of the life of St. Augustine
- Replacement of north and south windows in Women of Hope building.
- Sprinkler system in Women of Hope building

Further into the future, we will need to address several other projects, including:

- Assessment and restoration of church ceiling frescoes
- Assessment and restoration of church murals
- Renovations and improvements to Carr Hall
- Repairs in Friary building
- Restoration of clocks in church tower
- Repainting of church cupola

And so, as we joyfully celebrate the 225<sup>th</sup> anniversary of St. Augustine Church throughout 2021, we must also look ahead to the next phase of fundraising, which will go beyond the immediate parish and Augustinian Community. It will involve seeking grants, reaching out to the business and corporate community, possible crowdfunding efforts and more.

Again, we offer our sincere thanks and gratitude to you. We ask for your prayers for the continued success of the Capital Campaign, and in turn you have our prayers for peace, safety and health in the days and months ahead. Happy New Year to all!!
