A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

Within the discussion of marriage at our RCIA gathering this past week, the topics of annulments and divorce surfaced. As a result, I thought it might be a good idea to touch on each of these topics.

There are a number of misconceptions about annulments. One of the most common misconception is that if a couple is married in the Church and the marriage is annulled, the children of that marriage are illegitimate. That is absolutely not true. An annulment is strictly a church process. The annulment has no bearing whatsoever on the status of the children. Several other misconceptions concerning annulments are the cost of the annulment and the amount of time it takes for the process. Several years ago, Pope Francis initiated changes for this process. As a result of his initiative, there is no cost for an annulment. A donation would often be suggested and greatly appreciated to help with the expenses but there is no longer any required financial cost. One cannot buy an annulment. In many cases the time for the process is now shortened considerably. The reason for this is that now many cases can be decided in the local diocese or archdiocese.

What an annulment means is that something was missing from the beginning of the marriage to make it a valid, sacramental marriage. For example, if someone is totally immature at the time of the marriage and he or she is not capable of the responsibilities of marriage, it is not a valid marriage. If one of the couple felt forced to enter into the marriage, or had a reservation about it being a lifelong commitment, it is not a valid marriage. If one does not intend to have children or to have an exclusive relationship with his or her spouse, it is not a valid marriage. If someone has hidden a significant fact about his or her life, for example an addiction, it is not a valid marriage. This is not the person I thought I was marrying. Please notice that all of this is what the status is at the time of the marriage, not anything that develops after the marriage.

This is why a very thorough marriage preparation process is essential. It is important that couples be very well prepared to answer the questions which they are asked publicly at the marriage ceremony, i.e., that they came freely and without reservation, that they will accept children lovingly from God, and that they intend that this will be an exclusive relationship all the days of their lives. In other words, to be a valid and sacramental marriage both parties at the time of the marriage need be free, capable and intend that the marriage to be permanent, exclusive, and open to children.

A divorce itself is totally a civil affair. If a couple, married in the Church, is divorced, the church still considers them sacramentally married unless an annulment is received. A common misconception about divorce is that if someone is divorced they cannot receive communion. This is absolutely not true as long as the person has not remarried outside the church.

If a Catholic is married outside the Church, the Church does not recognize this as a valid, sacramental marriage. In this situation, a person does not need an annulment but after obtaining some documentation (baptism and marriage certificates), a person can apply for recognition that the civil marriage wasn't valid and sacramental. Once that is granted, one is free to celebrate a marriage in the Church. If a couple is married outside the Church and wish to be married in the Church, they too need to obtain the same documentation and then they are free to be married in the Church. This is called a Convalidation.

I know there are a lot of misconceptions about annulments and divorce. I know it can be very confusing. I hope the above clarifies some of that and doesn't make it even more confusing.
