A Biographical Sketch of an Augustinian Saint.....

BLESSED MAGDALENE ALBRICI, VIRGIN ♦ July 16th

Magdalene was born in Como (Italy) around 1415. Dedicated to the love of Jesus, she entered a religious community under the Rule of St. Augustine in a place called Brunate outside the city walls. By degrees the number of young vocations increased, so much so that the community achieved the status of a convent with the title of St. Andrew, while retaining the same Rule. Magdalene's one wish now was that the convent should belong canonically to the Order of St. Augustine. In 1455, the Augustinian Congregation of Lombardy did receive it into its jurisdiction, and this was definitively approved by Pius II on July 16, 1549. Above all Magdalene was a promoter of Augustinian life. She affiliated to the Order many women who were already leading consecrated lives in common, and through her influence the number of tertiaries, even men, increased around Como. As superior she constantly urged her sisters to strive toward greater holiness and always preferred to serve rather than command. She died in 1465, probably on May 15.

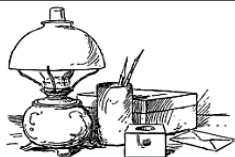

## *A word from Fr. Bill.....*

Dear Parishioners:

I recently received this email below. Because I thought it would be nice for the Parish Pastoral Council to be aware of it, I read it to them at their June 29th meeting. It was suggested by one of the Council members that it would be nice for the whole parish to hear it. I think it is important for you, the parishioners, to know what a positive effect you have on others, and, as in the case, the effect can be long lasting.

*Hello,*

*My husband and I are interested in having our two month old daughter, \*\*\*\*\*, baptized. We have a bit of a unique circumstance, though.*

*I was born and raised in New Jersey and grew up in the parish of \*\*\*\*\*. In our recent adult years, my husband and I found St. Augustine's and began attending Mass on a regular basis (often, the Sunday evening Mass). While we never registered as parishioners of St. Augustine's, we attended fairly regularly for a few years.*

*In 2012, my husband's career brought us to the Midwest; we now live in \*\*\*\*\*. With the recent arrival of our daughter, we have had many discussions about having her baptized in the Catholic Church. They were elated to talk about this. It is obvious the good memories they have of our parish. It is important that you know the wonderful impression you make on others.
