A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

As Catholics, the Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our lives. There is no parish without the Eucharist. We receive Jesus in the Eucharist. As we need physical food to nourish our physical lives, we need spiritual food to nourish our spiritual lives. We come together at Mass to not only receive nourishment from the Eucharist but also to receive nourishment from each other's presence. We are not alone on our journey. Just the opposite. We are united to each other through our baptism. We need signs of our unity with each other and with Jesus. Jesus certainly knew what he was doing when he gave us his body and blood and very definitively said that unless we eat his body and drink his blood, we do not have life (John 6: 53). Jesus knew what he was doing.

When the pandemic emerged, out of an abundance of caution the Bishops suspended the obligation of attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days. This was done in prudence to limit the spread of the virus thru physical contact. Now that the impact of the pandemic is greatly reduced, Archbishop Pérez communicated in a letter last week that it is time to lift the dispensation from the obligation as of August 15th. The Archbishop has made it clear that this does not apply to those "who are seriously ill, have a serious health risk, as well as those who have serious anxiety about being a part of large groups at this time. Likewise, the obligation does not apply to those who care for those who cannot attend Mass in person."

Sometimes, we do not like to hear the word "obligation." We, however, follow many obligations in society for the sake of the common good, e.g. stopping at red lights, paying taxes, showing up at work, going to school, etc. Fulfilling obligations can make very positive impacts on our secular community, our church community, family community, neighborhood community or in fact any community and not fulfilling obligations can have very negative effects on a community.

When the pandemic emerged in March, 2020, we as a parish surveyed many parishioners to see how we might stay connected as a parish when we had to be separated. As a result of that survey, some parishioners began to come together on Tuesday nights to say the rosary. Some parishioners began to come together on Thursday evenings to share insights into the scripture readings for the following Sunday. My weekly letter began to be directly emailed to parishioners each week. We began live streaming Mass. We tried to call as many parishioners individually as we could to see how they were coping during the pandemic. Many began to make their weekly contributions by electronic giving.

We are grateful to the scientists who so rapidly developed an extremely effective vaccination to subdue the virus. This has helped us to return to some "normal" ways of living in society and now in the Church. Thank you, God.

As they say, "See you in church."
