## A word from Fr. Bill....

#### Dear Parishioners:

In the Gospel last weekend Jesus invited the disciples to go away with him to a deserted place and rest awhile. He could have told them there were other villages to visit. He could have responded more immediately to those "who were like sheep without a shepherd." But he didn't do either of these two things. He had them go and withdraw together. As I said in the homily, it was a priority for him that they spend some quality time with each other. He wanted to hear their stories from their ministry and he wanted them to hear some insights and suggestions he had for them

I am going to be responding this week to that invitation of Jesus. I am taking the opportunity "to retreat" with him to a quiet place, "The Jesuit Center for Spiritual Growth" in Wernersville. PA. I will leave Monday morning and return Sunday morning. I will be participating in what is known as a "five-day silent directed retreat." The five days are totally in silence (including meals) with the exception of a meeting with a director one hour a day. Each day the director will give me various scripture passages with such to reflect and then to discuss with him the next day. It is an opportunity in a spiritual atmosphere to look at all the aspects of my life and ministry in a prayerful way and then to discuss those things with the director. How has God been working in my life? How does God want to continue to work in my life? Pray for me as I will for you.

Many people do not have the luxury to be able to have such an experience, but I encourage everyone to be creative and to find some opportunity, even for an hour, a half a day or a day, to do the same.

Please notice the pictures of the windows being installed in the "Women of Hope" building. This is the first of four phases (north, south, east and west) of this project. The cost of this phase for fifteen windows is \$57,000 (\$47,000 for the windows and \$10,000 for the pre-painting of the interior and exterior of the windows). This is being financed directly by the Capital Campaign. As you know many other projects need to be financed by the Capital Campaign as well--assessing and restoring artwork in church, restoring the bathrooms in church, providing wheelchair accessible bathrooms in the church and Carr Hall, brick repointing of the church, restoring the façade of the church, steeple louvers and a number of other projects. I am happy to report that as of Tuesday of this past week, we now have just over \$300,000 pledged to the Campaign. This is approximately 40% of our goal of \$750,000. I thought you would like to see one of the first visible benefits of the Campaign by seeing the windows which were installed this past week.
