

A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

Once again I am very grateful to a second parishioner who generously gave a \$500 gift to the parish to help offset the unexpected and unbudgeted expenses of \$30,000 (facade study, facade repairs, repair to the church air conditioner). The parish is very blessed to be the recipient of such kindness.

As I mentioned last weekend Ignacio Romanowski (aka Junior) will receive Confirmation and Holy Communion for the first time at the 7:00 PM Mass this weekend. Preceding this Liturgy, he and Pierre Hannecart who will be baptized, confirmed and receive First Communion at a date to be determined, will spend about 5 hours of quality time in "retreat" on Sunday. They both have been faithful participants with me and Patrick Lanza who is the parish's representative to the RCIA process each Thursday night since September. Sunday afternoon is an opportunity for them to reflect on the year and to prepare to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation. Some would say "wow that is a long time on a Sunday to do something like that." As we understand our tradition better in the Church, we can see that Jesus and others spent quality time in prayer before making major decisions.

With that thought in mind and as we celebrate Pentecost this weekend, may we reflect on Pope Francis' recent words concerning making decisions.

The Holy Spirit, the Pope said, moves hearts as we can read in the Gospels that tell of many people who are moved to approach Jesus, like Nicodemus, like the woman who had been subject to bleeding for twelve years, like the Samaritan, like the sinner. Thus the Pope invited the faithful to ask themselves: 'what place does the Holy Spirit have in my life?'

"Am I able to hear it? Am I able to ask for inspiration before taking a decision or doing something? Or is my heart quiet, lacking in emotion and turmoil?" he said.

And he commented on the fact that, "should an EKG be performed on some hearts, the result would be a flat line – totally lacking in emotion." Doesn't that sound like the Pope?

He said that even in the Gospels there are "still" hearts: "we think of the doctors of the law, they believed in God, they knew all the commandments, but their hearts were closed, they were "still," they were not disturbed."

As Junior is confirmed and receives the Eucharist for the first time on Sunday, we thank God that the Holy Spirit has moved his heart as He did for so many as mentioned by Pope Francis and we thank God that Junior has responded as so many also have to this prompting.

May we all ask for the grace to hear the Holy Spirit in our own lives and in the lives of our families and also in the direction and decisions we make here in our parish community at St. Augustine's.

Have a Spirit filled week.
