



A word from Fr. Bill

Dear Parishioners:

We are delighted to announce that Archbishop Perez has given permission to resume public Masses this weekend in the churches of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. A great deal of thought and discussion have gone into the preparation to come together after almost three months of not celebrating the Eucharist with each other in person. Please see the insert in this bulletin for all the specifics involved with this. Also, I am sending a video to you outlining all these details. I want to extend my gratitude to the members of the Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Staff for all of their consultation involving this preparation. Everyone is expected to wear a mask and we ask everyone to bring sanitizing wipes with them. Again, please see the insert in this bulletin and watch the video concerning all these details which will be sent.

We will resume our weekday 12:05 PM Mass on Monday.

I want to remind everyone that the Archbishop has dispensed the faithful from the obligation of Sunday Mass until further notice and that he directs that those who are sick, or at a higher risk for contracting the coronavirus to please not come to church. Even though one might not come to church, please "keep Holy the Sabbath." Although it is not the same, you can watch our livestreaming 11:00 AM Mass or watch other Masses provided on television. We can read and discuss with family members or with friends the scripture readings for the day. If you cannot get to Mass, hopefully you will find another way to keep the Sabbath holy.

On another happy topic, all things being equal, Brett Schneider and Lindsay Waqar who have been participating in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults this past year will make a Profession of Faith to the Catholic Church, receive the Eucharist for the first time, and be Confirmed at the 7:00 PM Mass next Sunday evening, June 14th. Fr. Bill Donnelly (the older Fr. Bill) who journeyed with Brett and Lindsay in this process will preside at the Mass.

Many Capital Improvements to our parish property recently have taken place or are about to begin. Major work to the air conditioning system of the church has been completed. Façade work on the lower part of the steeple will begin very soon as well as major construction for the stability of the tunnel underneath the church. I am very grateful to the Parish Finance Commission and the Steering Committee for the Capital Campaign for all of their consultation concerning these projects. Also, I publicly want to thank Bob Zigmund, our Director of Facilities, for working with the various contractors and overseeing these projects. Both of these projects, especially the tunnel work, will create some inconveniences around the property, like access to Carr Hall. Please be patient with all this—temporary inconvenience for permanent improvement.

I look forward to seeing many of you this weekend.
