

A word from Fr. Bíll...

Dear Parishioners:

The constitutions of the Augustinian Order direct that each Province (in our case, the East Coast Friars) meet in "Provincial Chapter" every four years. One of the purposes is for the planning for the next four years. Our constitutions (316) says, "The friars gathered in the Provincial Chapter must desire the good of the Province with their whole heart and strive to attain it as far as possible."

Beginning this Sunday evening and ending next Friday afternoon, Fr. Paul, Fr. Jim K, Fr. Jim P and I will be participating in our Provincial Chapter which will take place at Villanova.

On Sunday evening, we will have an opportunity "to meet and greet" friars we haven't seen for a while, especially those serving out of the country and we also will handle some pragmatic details for the week.

Monday, basically will be a day of prayer: time for some spiritual input and private reflection. On Monday evening, Fr. Rob Hagan, OSA will be installed as our new Provincial. Our Prior General from Rome, Fr. Alejandro Moral, OSA who was here at St Augustine's a few years ago for the Sinulog, will preside at the installation. Over the past several months there was a lengthy process for Fr. Rob's election. As an aside, Fr. Rob will be here on August 21st for this year's Sinulog. His installation marks the beginning for the direction of our Province for the next four years.

As all Religious Orders, we face challenging times with fewer vocations, a larger number of retired and infirm friars, a changing world and Church and consequently changing needs of God's people. For example, 30 friars from our Province have died since our last Provincial Chapter four years ago, a number of whom were in active ministry.

In the past two years, we as a province had many Zoom meetings providing opportunities for conversations among the friars to raise the major themes which we need to discuss. With all this in mind, we continually ask how we can best live in community and respond to the needs of our friars and the needs of the people we serve in very changing times.

On Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday there will be various panels discussing the themes which surfaced from our two years of Zoom meetings, for example, topics like conversion of ourselves and our Province as well as our work in evangelization, social justice, education, and parish ministries. We will discuss the care of our retired and infirm friars and also the ways we may best relate to the two other Provinces in our country.


As a result of all of this, there will be recommendations on how we as a Province and we as individual friars will approach the next four years.

The War in Ukraine....

Russia's invasion of Ukraine has already forced over 6 million refugees to flee. The world watched in shock as the Russian military invaded Ukraine in February 2022 and began targeting homes, hospitals, bridges and schools.

More than 6 million people—mostly women and children—have left to seek safety in neighboring Moldova, Poland and other European states amid the growing crisis in Ukraine.
