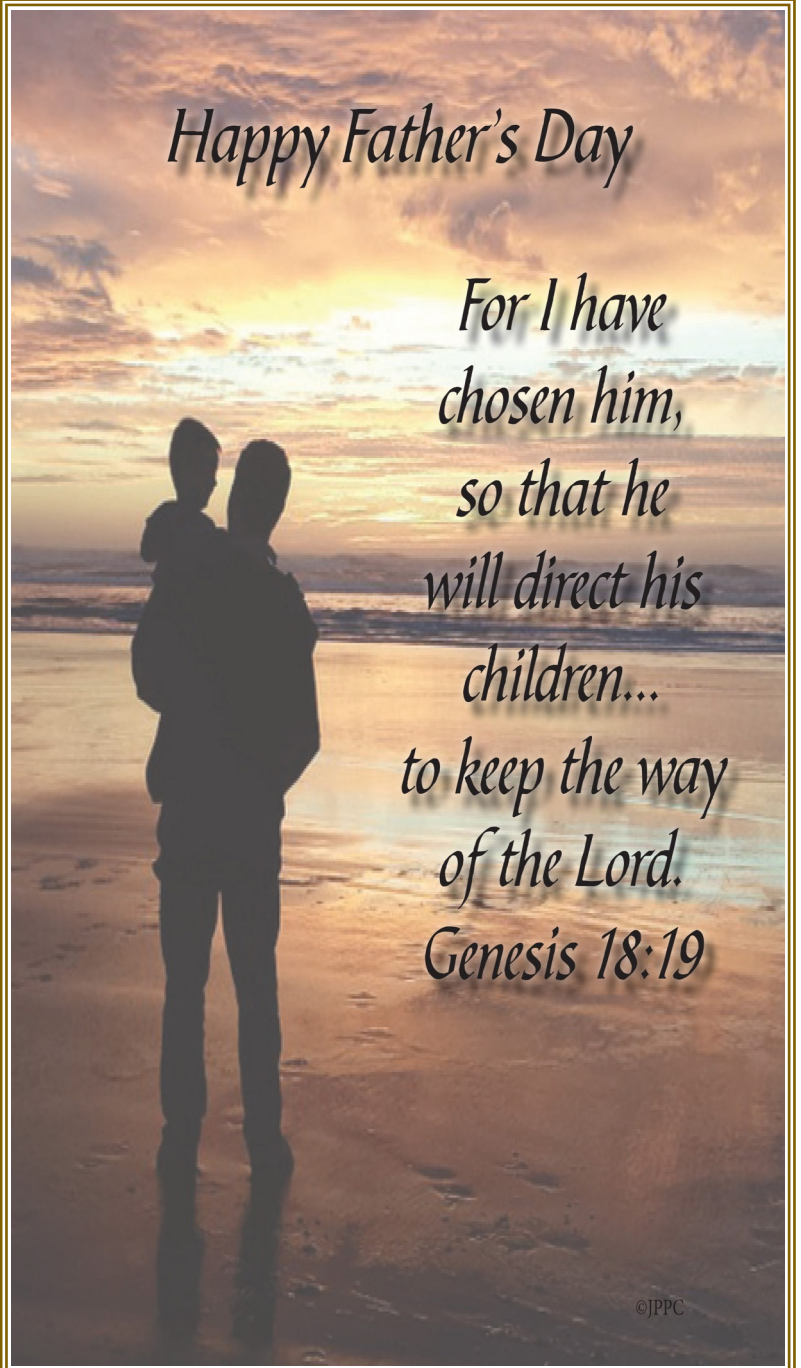

A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend is very significant to our parish for three reasons:

The first is Giselle Buella will be making her First Communion at the 11:00 AM Mass on Sunday. Gisele has been preparing for this very important occasion for quite a bit of time now. Her parents have been preparing her at home and bringing her to Mass each weekend for several years--usually sitting in the first pew near the choir. For the past year, she has been preparing more intensively by meeting with Jackie Lanza on a regular basis. I am very grateful to Jackie for this dedication and service to our parish community. We congratulate Giselle as she continues her journey of initiation into the Church by fully participating in the Eucharist with us for the first time.

Secondly, this is Father Day's weekend. Thank you fathers, grandfathers, Godfathers, foster fathers, stepfathers, adopted fathers and all you father figures for reflecting our God to your children. This is incredibly important and challenging in the culture of our society today. You have a tremendous responsibility and play a crucial role to many. We thank you for taking all of this so seriously. You never fully know the impact you have on the lives of a number of people.

Thirdly, at the recommendation of the members of our Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), we will begin this weekend to pray together for God's blessings on our Parish Capital Campaign. I was told you did this a number of years ago during the last Capital Campaign. I brought the topic to the May meeting of the PPC and asked for their advice of saying this prayer together as a community at the end of each of our weekend Masses. I was concerned people might think it was too long, or too repetitive, but the Council members strongly advised me to do this. One of the members said, "it takes less than a minute." Another said "it is a good reminder that we are doing this." When the 15 solicitors were commissioned, it was done in the context of a prayer service. It is essential that we do not just depend on ourselves for the success of the campaign and that we ask for God's blessings on our solicitors, our donors, our steering committee and all those involved. We need direction, inspiration and a generous attitude by all those involved. This includes our efforts within the parish and our efforts when we reach out beyond the parish. You will find the prayer in the inside of the front of our missalette where the table of content is. Thank you for praying this with us. I am very happy to give you the update that we recently exceeded a quarter of a million dollars in pledges from 51 parishioners. This is one third of our goal. Thank you, Lord, for the blessings you have already bestowed on us.
