FAST AND ABSTINENCE AND OTHER ACTS OF PENANCE FOR LENT 2019

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, March 06, 2019, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

Lent is the penitential season of the Church's year. It begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. Lent has six Sundays. The sixth is called Passion or Palm Sunday and marks the beginning of Holy week.

The Easter Triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. It commemorates the Lord's passion and death on Good Friday, reaches its high point at the Easter Vigil and ends with evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. Then the joyful Easter Season of 50 days begins.

ASHES and ASH WEDNESDAY

The ashes used on Ash Wednesday are made from the burning of palms blessed in the previous year's Palm Sunday celebration, when Christians carry palms to recognize the Gospels' reference to Jesus's path being covered in palm fronds on the day he entered Jerusalem.

Ash Wednesday is a Christian holy day of prayer, fasting, and repentance. It is preceded by Shrove Tuesday and falls on the first day of Lent, the six weeks of penitence before Easter. Ash Wednesday is observed by many Christians, including Anglicans, Episcopalians, Lutherans, Methodists, Presbyterians, Roman Catholics, and some Baptists.

Ash Wednesday derives its name from the placing of repentance ashes on the foreheads of participants to either the words "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or the dictum "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."



Friday Evenings During Lent 7:00 P.M.

Come, walk, and meditate on the Way of the Cross

Because it is the first day of Lent, many Christians, on Ash Wednesday, often begin marking a Lenten calendar, praying a Lenten daily devotional, and abstaining from a luxury that they will not partake in until Easter Sunday arrives.

Ashes are ceremonially placed on the heads of Christians on Ash Wednesday, either by being sprinkled over their heads or, in English-speaking countries, more often by being marked on their foreheads as a visible cross. This custom is credited to Pope Gregory I the Great (c. 540 –604). In the 1969 revision of the Roman Rite, an alternative formula (based on Mark 1:15) was introduced and given first place "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" and the older formula was translated as "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The old formula, based on the words spoken to Adam and Eve after their sin, reminds worshippers of their sinfulness and mortality and thus, implicitly, of their need to repent in time. The newer formula makes explicit what was only implicit in the old.

Ash Wednesday marks the start of a 40-day period which is an allusion to the separation of Jesus in the desert to fast and pray. During this time, he was tempted. While not specifically instituted in the Bible text, the 40-day period of repentance is also analogous to the 40 days during which Moses repented and fasted in response to the making of the Golden calf.

Ash Wednesday is exactly 46 days before Easter Sunday, a moveable feast based on the cycles of the moon. The earliest date Ash Wednesday can occur is 4 February (which is only possible during a common year with Easter on 22 March), which happened in 1598, 1693, 1761 and 1818 and will next occur in 2285. The latest date Ash Wednesday can occur is 10 March (when Easter Day falls on 25 April) which occurred in 1666, 1734, 1886 and 1943 and will next occur in 2038.

A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

The Archdiocese has asked us to observe "Safe Haven Sunday" this weekend. It is a time for us to become more aware of the prominence of pornography in our society. You will find in the back of the church some prayer cards to guide our prayer about this challenge, and some booklets entitled, Equipped, to help parents with some good suggestions in raising their children in a sexualized culture.

As you know, this **Wednesday is Ash Wednesday** and the **beginning of Lent**. This is a season for us to use various resources to help us prepare to renew our baptismal vows at Easter. Ashes will be distributed on Wednesday within the 12:05 PM and 7:00 PM Masses. We will be providing a number of resources of prayer, fasting and almsgiving to help you prepare to renew your baptismal promises:

- ⇒ As we have in past years, we will be **distributing a pin with a cross and ashes**. We encourage you to wear it during Lent as an outward sign of your preparation to renew your vows.
- ⇒ You will find in the back of the church two booklets to support your prayer life during Lent: **Daily Reflections** of the scripture passages of each day and **Open Your Heart to God**, a reflection each day by either Pope Francis, Thomas Merton, or Henri Nouwen.
- ⇒ Of course, we will have **Daily Mass Monday-Friday at 12:05 PM**.
- ⇒ In addition to the regular time for the opportunity for confessions on Saturday afternoons at 4:30 PM, the Sacrament of Reconciliation also will be available after the 11:00 AM and 7:00 PM Masses on Sundays.
- ⇒ Another form of prayer is to participate in the Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings at 7:00 PM.
- ⇒ Participating in **Operation Rice Bowl** is a means of almsgiving by donating money that we do not spend from whatever we are abstaining or fasting. Please take a bowl (folded) in the back of the church.
- ⇒ Another means of almsgiving is to prepare a "Blessing Bag" of food & toiletries and clothes distributed by the Franciscan Outreach of the Padre Pio Prayer Center (at which 10 of our parishioners are volunteering) to the homeless, drug addicted and their families in the Frankford/Kensington area. You will find bags in the back of the church and instructions/suggestions on what to fill them with. An insert is also in this bulletin.
- ⇒ During the **Tuesdays of Lent (7:00 PM to 8:30 PM)** we will have an opportunity to know better the person of St. Augustine, his restlessness and the resources that helped him. Please sign up in the back of the church.
- ⇒ On Tuesday, April 2nd we will have the opportunity to publicly express our opposition to legalized abortion by praying near the Planned Parenthood at 12th and Locust Sts. Please sign up in the back of the church.

If you have not already done so, please be sure to **fill out the parish survey** facilitated by the Catholic Leadership Institute. You will find a link for it on the homepage of our parish website, or you can fill it out manually. There are hard copies in English and Tagalog in the back of the church. Doing this will help us tremendously to plan for the future.

Next Sunday at the 11:00 AM Mass, **Karen Connolly** (Catechumen to be Baptized, receive First Holy Communion and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil) and **Ashley Foreman** (Candidate to be received into the Church) and **Tom White** (Candidate for Confirmation) will participate in the "Sending Forth" liturgy as they prepare to go to the Cathedral with Archbishop Chaput to participate in the "Rite of Election." They are entering into the Period of Purification and Enlightenment, the final phase in the preparation to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. There will be more about this next weekend in the bulletin.

ABOUT REMAIN IN MY LOVE

In 2017, Archbishop Charles J. Chaput announced a three year project, Remain in My Love, directed to every member of the clergy and lay faithful, to every parish and institution and to the families of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. Its goal is to reinvigorate our understanding, practices and celebrations of Christian marriage and family life.

Year 1 (2017) was addressed to the Archdiocesan Pastoral Center and Year 2 (2018) was for parish staffs. This third and final year (2019) brings the Church's good news about marriage and family life to all of the people of the Archdiocese. The three key topics of Years 1 and 2 will be presented in Plenary Sessions throughout the Archdiocese and are open to everyone. These presentations aim to immerse all of us in the splendor of Christ's teachings about marriage and family and to provide a way for married couples and families to meet and support one another. There is no more urgent time than now to bring marriage and family to new life and to work to protect this most precious institution created by God.

The 2019 Plenary Sessions will take place primarily on Sundays. Families are encouraged to "make a day of it", attending Mass together, perhaps going out to eat together and then attending a session. All are asked to register for the sessions at <u>archphila.org/remain2019</u>.

The Plenary Sessions will include:

- Keynote address by a national Catholic speaker
- A personal witness from a married couple
- Discussion, Q & A and a call to action on the topic
- · Childcare will be available at each session
- Local marriage and family ministry information

Dear Parishioners:

As the result of group discussions last Lent and Advent on how we as a parish might respond to the drug and homeless problem in our society, we have now established a relationship with the Franciscan Outreach of the Padre Pio Prayer Center in Frankford. One of the important needs identified is the need for daily hygiene and food/personal items as well as clothing items to help the homeless get through the rough winter months.



Lent this year begins on Wednesday, March 6, 2019. During Lent, we are customarily asked to do three things (as a minimum), that of Prayer, Fasting and Alms Giving. We can do all three with the homeless and drug addicted in mind. First, let us offer daily prayer that God will provide for, comfort and help them to find support services. Secondly, through fasting, we can use the money that we would normally spend on food and drinks, to provide for the less fortunate. Finally, alms giving or sacrificial offerings. This year we are asking our parishioners to consider providing "Blessing Bags" that will be given to the homeless. Included on this flyer, you will see a picture and a list of suggested personal items that can be placed in a gallon-sized Ziploc bag and then they will be taken to the Padre Pio Prayer Center in Frankford and distributed to the homeless and drug addicted population in the Frankford and Kensington area of our city. These small personal items can help to restore the dignity of one's person as well as appearance.

There is also a need for some clothing items such as: gloves, warm hats, hoodies, white socks, underwear (men and women), pants, jeans, sweatpants and winter coats. We ask that underwear is new and socks can be slightly used. If you are able to provide the Blessing Bags or clothing, it can be dropped off in the large boxes in the rear of the church.

Thank you for your generosity of helping the less fortunate in our community and may you have a blessed and fruitful Lent this year.


