

A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

This past December, Pope Francis announced that this year would be a year dedicated to St. Joseph. He chose this year because it is the 150th Anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph being named the Patron of the Universal Church. He said the year would be observed from December 8 of 2020 until December 8 of 2021.

Popes often set aside time for us to reflect more deeply on a specific aspect of our faith or a specific person in our Church history. For example, a few years ago, there was a year dedicated to St. Paul. Another year was dedicated to the Eucharist. In choosing to focus on St. Joseph, the Pope points out that St. Joseph had an ordinary job, a carpenter. He was willing to listen to God's word and God's messengers. He was a faithful husband and most importantly the father of Jesus and the Protector of the Holy Family. There are many attributes and virtues upon which for us to reflect and imitate.

At our February 24th Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) meeting, I asked the members of the Council to discuss what we as a parish might do to celebrate this year of St. Joseph and specifically what we might do to bring attention to him and his virtues.

The PPC mainly came up with 5 suggestions:

- 1. We pray to St. Joseph at the end of each Sunday's Mass in the form of a litany.
- 2. That we include one petition in the Prayer of the Faithful each week asking St. Joseph to intercede for us.
- 3. That during the month of March in which his feast is celebrated (March 19th) we put the statue of St. Joseph in the sanctuary.
- 4. That at the Masses on Sunday, May 2nd, we have a special blessing for all workers. The feast of St. Joseph the Worker is the day before, Saturday, May 1st.
- 5. That during the year we pay special attention to the historic painting of St. Joseph which is in our sanctuary. This piece of art was painted by a very famous artist, Filipino Costaggini.

Since this weekend is the first weekend of March, we will begin the first three suggestions of the PPC this weekend.


It is hoped that by doing these things and perhaps other things (like a discussion group on the Pope's apostolic letter about St. Joseph entitled "With a Father's Loving Heart") we will increase our knowledge and appreciation of St. Joseph, that we will be more conscious to pray to God thru the intercession of St. Joseph, and that we are inspired to imitate in our lives his virtues, particularly prudence, obedience, justice, patience, fidelity, courage and chastity.

St. Joseph has a unique role as the Patron and Protector of the Universal Church and of our Augustinian community. May we come to a greater appreciation of that this year.
