A word from Fr. Bíll...

Dear Parishioners:

For the next three weeks we will celebrate the "Three Scrutinies" which are part of the RCIA process. The First Scrutiny is at the 7:00 PM Mass this weekend. The Second Scrutiny at the 11:00 AM Mass on Sunday, March 19th and the Third Scrutiny is at the 9:00 AM Mass on Sunday, March 26th.

What are the Scrutinies? When we scrutinize something we look at it carefully and examine it thoroughly. Those who are in the final preparation of becoming Catholic are asked to do just that, look at themselves carefully and examine themselves thoroughly, These Rites for those preparing to have full union with the Catholic Church are meant "to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in their hearts and then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good." In other words, those preparing to become Catholic "look within themselves to find anything that keeps them from Christ. Then they look to Christ to heal those weaknesses and strengthen themselves when they face temptation."

I would like to suggest that the Scrutinies also can be used for all of us as we prepare to renew our baptism promises at Easter.

As we ask Ted Baker, our Candidate for full communion with the Church, to participate in the Scrutinies, may all of us do the same. As we celebrate the three Scrutinies with Ted, I recommend that we scrutinize ourselves concerning the three Lenten practices/disciplines which Jesus mentions in the Gospel on Ash Wednesday when we began out Lenten journey: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. I would like to reflect on one of these each of the next three weeks as we celebrate the three Scrutinizes with Ted. The first is prayer.

How is my prayer life? What is good and what could be improved? Do I spend some time each day in prayer? When we were children we learned that prayer should include "ACTS": adoration, contrition, thanksgiving and supplication. When I pray do I give God praise? Do I acknowledge my sinfulness? For what do I ask of God? Do I give God thanksgiving?

St. Ignatius of Loyola gives us "The Examen." At the end of a day he suggests that I take time to be aware that I am in God's presence. I reflect on how did God see my day? As I review the day, I give thanks to God for the good things that happened that day and I name my short comings of the day, being honest with what I could have done better. I tell God for what I am looking forward to the next day and try to be aware what God wants to happen thru me the next day.

St. Augustine says that the "Our Father" is the most perfect prayer because it contains everything that needs to be in prayer. Can I say it slowly, not as a memorized prayer, but reflecting on what each of the phrases means?

Can I pray (even for 3-5 minutes a day) with my family? The family that prays together stays together. Do we wonder why so many families do not stay together?

Can I take 15 minutes a day in "Centering Prayer," centering totally on God's presence within me?

There are many resources in the back of the church (and online) which suggest reflections for each day. There are tapes, CDs (old fashioned) to which I can listen on my way to work.

There are a number of opportunities of praying with fellow parishioners on Zoom during Lent: participating in discussions on the Creed on Tuesday nights, sharing insights into scripture on Thursday nights, being informed about the paintings in the sanctuary on Thursday nights (in person and LiveStreamed) and reflecting on the 14 stations of the Cross on Friday nights.

We can't integrate all these forms of prayer into our lives at once but as we prepare to renew our baptism promises at Easter, may we look at our prayer life carefully and examine it thoroughly, reflecting on what is good and what can be improved.

Next week, I will share some thoughts on fasting and the following week some thoughts on almsgiving.

Join us for three Thursday evenings in Lent to contemplate, discuss, and learn more about the three altar paintings.


