A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

In the Gospels last week (The Prodigal Son) and this week (The woman caught in adultery) we hear two very moving stories about mercy. I think a problem is we hear these stories so often we can lose the depth of what God wants to reveal to us.

It was against the culture for the father in last week's Gospel to run to his son and to kiss and embrace him. Imagine how ashamed and embarrassed the son must have felt to have to tell his father that he sinned against him and against God by squandering all that the father had given him. Imagine how he felt being accepted back and treated like royalty with a ring, a robe and sandals.

Imagine how ashamed, humiliated, embarrassed and scared the woman must have been who was caught "in the very act of adultery." Imagine how relieved she must have felt when no one threw a stone and she heard Jesus say that he didn't condemn her. She had to feel like a new woman. She had to be grateful that she was given a chance to start fresh again.

You and I can have the same feelings of the prodigal son in last week's Gospel and the woman in this week's Gospel. We can move from feeling embarrassed, ashamed and afraid to feeling mercy. That is why Jesus gave us the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Some people say, "I just confess to God. Why do I have to go to another person who also sins." Why? So that we can experience what the Prodigal Son and the woman experienced: relief, forgiveness, and an opportunity to start over.

It is no secret that Confession is an underused sacrament. What a shame not to take advantage of the means which Jesus has given us to experience Him saying: "I do not condemn you."

Next Sunday is Passion (Palm) Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. A wonderful way "to start over" as we renew our baptismal vows at Easter is to experience the same mercy, forgiveness and acceptance which the Prodigal Son and the woman caught in adultery experienced. We have confessions here at St. Augustine Parish every Saturday from 4:30 to 5:00 PM and during Lent after the 11:00 AM and 7:00 PM Masses and certainly any time by appointment.
