

### A word from Fr. Bill...

#### Dear Parishioners:

For the past few weeks I have mentioned the topic of the Synod which has been called by Pope Francis. It is an extraordinary thing that Pope Francis is inviting lay people into the process. I hope as many of our parishioners as possible can be part of this process. As I mentioned last week, there will be an opportunity to participate in this historic moment of the Church at the newly constructed Cascia Center at the St. Rita National Shrine (1166 South Broad St.) next Sunday, March 27th from 3:00 PM to 5:30 PM, followed by refreshments. It would be helpful to let us know if you are planning to take part in this discussion.

In the words of Pope Francis, "In the one People of God, therefore, let us journey together, in order to experience a Church that received and lives this gift of unity, and is open to the voice of the Spirit." As Pope Francis envisions, it is an opportunity to dream about the Church which we are called to be.

The purpose of the gathering is to help ascertain where the Holy Spirit may be leading the Church. In order to do this, there will be time to pray, to listen, and to discern where the Spirit may be leading us as the People of God.

The three questions which we will be discussing are:

"What do you find valuable or encouraging in the Catholic Church today that helps you on your journey?"

"What areas could the Church address that would help you on your journey?"

"What role have the Augustinians played on your journey and what might be helpful as you continue your journey?"

For each of these questions there will be time for prayer (silent reflection), listening to the thoughts of others, more silent reflection, and discerning ideas for the future.

As I mentioned, this is a historic moment in the history of the Church, inviting all members of the Church to participate in this process. For planning purposes, if you plan to join us (3:00 PM to 5:30 PM next Sunday, March 27th), please call the Parish Office (215-627-1838 or email me at pastorstaugustine@gmail.com. One can still participate in the discussion, even if you have not registered. Hope to see you there.

In connection with the Synod in which Pope Francis is asking all Catholics to participate, all the parishes in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia are asked to participate in a "survey" entitled Disciples Maker Index. I strongly encourage all of our parishioners to take advantage of this opportunity. This helps our parish and the entire Archdiocese to be aware of positive things which are happening and at the same time to respond to the needs which are not being met. The survey is very user friendly and takes about 15 minutes to complete.

### **Fast & Abstinence During Lent**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.


