

A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

As you know St. Augustine Parish has been facilitating a series of discussions on the sacraments. We did this in Advent 2020 and have continued during Lent 2021.

On Tuesday, March 9th we discussed the Sacrament of Marriage. It was a great discussion and I would like to share several topics which surfaced, namely divorce people going to communion and grounds for an annulment.

First of all, it is vitally important to point out that the Church does not say that people who are divorced cannot go to communion. For whatever reasons, it is a misconception that divorce people cannot receive the Eucharist. Divorce is totally a civil situation. Just because someone is divorced, it does not mean that they are not in good standing with the Church. Naturally, it is not the ideal situation, but in some circumstances, it may even be necessary. Being divorced and remarried not in the Church is a totally different situation.

That brings up the topic of annulments. What is an annulment? An annulment is not a Catholic divorce. An annulment means something essential for the marriage to be sacramentally valid was missing at the time of the marriage. Some essential elements for the validity of marriage are being free to marry, intention that this relationship will be exclusive, intention that this will be a permanent relationship, and openness to children. Being free means I wasn't forced for any reason to get married. Intention of exclusiveness is the intention that there will be no one else with whom I will be so intimately involved. Intention of permanence means no matter what happens we will be with each other all the days of our lives. Being open to children means that we will allow God to use us in God's plan of procreation. This presumes a sense of maturity on both persons, a knowledge of the person with whom I am making a commitment, capabilities of the two persons to enter into such a relationship, and freedom from addictions at the time of the marriage. All these considerations are in reference to the intentions and the circumstances of the individuals at the time of the marriage, not developments that may happen later in the marriage. Recently, Pope Francis has streamlined the process for an annulment. The process does not necessarily take as long as it used to and there is no cost/charge for an annulment. A donation is always welcome.

I mention these things because in the discussion we had a few weeks ago concerning the Sacrament of Marriage, misconceptions about both divorce and annulments surfaced. I thought it might be valuable to share the fruit of that discussion with the parish as a whole.
