A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

Once again, we have the opportunity to enter into the holiest week of the Church year. I invite all of us to prayerfully enter into it. It is a week for us to reflect on and to celebrate the central events in the life of Jesus. We reflect on His humanity (suffering and death) and His divinity (the Resurrection) and how all of these things relate to us today.

This weekend, we recall how some of the people of Jesus' day wanted to declare Him king and do as they hailed Him with palm. They were impressed with all the miracles he did and they wanted to be the recipient of some. (Wouldn't you want Him at your party to change water into wine?) Then we hear the same people turn on Him because He told them that wasn't His mission, but that His mission was to suffer and die and if anyone wanted to follow Him, they would have to do the same. They didn't like hearing this. It wasn't quite as appealing.

Thursday, we recall Jesus' example of service. Only servants washed feet but here Jesus was washing the feet of His friends and telling them if they were going to be his followers they had to do the same. Then he gave us the great gift of the Eucharist, the sign of our unity and the bond of our community. There is no Church without the Eucharist. Receiving Jesus' Body and Blood is a sign that Jesus is with us and nourishes us on our journey to the kingdom. At this liturgy (7:30 PM), we also will receive the Holy Oils, which Archbishop Chaput will bless at the Cathedral earlier in the day. We will commission our newest Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and install our new Lectors. There will be the opportunity to pray before the Blessed Sacrament until 10:00 PM when we will pray the Evening Prayer of the Church together.

On Good Friday afternoon (3:00 PM), we will hear the Passion of Christ, venerate the Cross and even though it is technically not a Mass, we will receive the Eucharist.

On Good Friday evening (7:30 PM), Father Jim and a number of our parishioners will help us reflect on "The Seven Last Words," the last things Jesus said before he died. Those who will share a reflection and on what they will reflect is as follows:

Fr. Jim Keating, OSA --"Father, forgive them for they do not know what they do."

Anne Marie Bonner --"Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

Ed Riehl --"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

Paul Dacanay--"Woman, here is your son...Here is your mother."

Greg and Lily Walsh --"Father, into your hands I commend my spirit."

Keith Weikel --"I am thirsty."

Dr. Lita Manguba--"It is finished."

At the Easter Vigil (which I call the super bowl of liturgies) on Holy Saturday night (7:30 PM), we will have the blessing of the Easter Fire outside, the singing of the beautiful Exsultet, and the opportunity of hearing scripture readings describing our salvation history. It is at this liturgy that our Elect, **Katie Kenny**, **Miles Humenansky**, and **Evan Schaffner** will be baptized, confirmed, and receive Jesus for the first time in the Eucharist. Of course, it is at this liturgy that we celebrate the culmination of Lent as we celebrate Jesus' Resurrection, the central mystery of our faith, and renew our baptismal vows.

When we think of all we remember, all that we celebrate, and all that we believe which we publicly proclaim this week, it truly is a Holy Week. I hope we can all truly enter into it.
