



A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

As Ted Baker, our Candidate for full communion with the Catholic Church, participates this weekend (9:00 AM Mass) in the 3rd Scrutiny of the RCIA process, we continue to scrutinize the three disciplines of Lent in our own lives. In the last two weeks, I suggested we scrutinize ourselves in the area of prayer and fasting. This week, I suggest we "look at ourselves carefully and thoroughly" in the area of almsgiving.

What is our understanding of almsgiving? The Catholic Church considers almsgiving "a witness to fraternal charity" and "a work of justice pleasing to God" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, No. 2462). Almsgiving is the act of donating money or goods to the poor or performing other acts of charity, sharing time and talents.

As I mentioned last week, the spirituality of fasting goes back to the Old Testament. So, also the notion of almsgiving goes back to the Old Testament as well, especially in the form of tithing. Tithing is an Old Testament concept. To tithe was a requirement of the Law in which the Israelites were to give 10 percent of the crops they grew and the livestock they raised to the tabernacle/temple (Leviticus 27:30; Numbers 18:26; Deuteronomy 14:24; 2 Chronicles 31:5). They would keep 90% of their crops and livestock for themselves and their livelihood and give 10 percent for charity. The New Testament does not mention tithing specifically, but St. Paul says "Each person should give what he/she has decided in the heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7).

Today, we might not use the word almsgiving or tithing, but maybe charity and sharing. Whatever word we want to use; it is a lifestyle. It is a conscious decision. It is a way of thinking. It is the awareness that all good things come from God and I need to give back to God and not just hoard for myself. This applies to what I receive as a salary, an inheritance or even from winnings at the casino. It is a mindset as opposed to I will give the minimum or I give something as a token expression. I feel conspicuous if the basket goes by and I don't put anything in it. So, I put something in the basket in order to just put something in the basket. I encourage couples with whom I meet for marriage preparation to include in their budget a percentage of their income for charity in addition to how much money is in their budget for housing, food, school payments, recreation, vacation, etc.

Charity certainly is not only for the Church. It can be for the Boys and Girls Club, the YMCA, the YWCA, the Little Sisters of the Poor, etc. Again, it is a mindset. It is a conscious lifestyle.

We have many parishioners in our parish community for whom this is a deliberate lifestyle. Each week we publish a report in the bulletin on the contributions to the parish from the previous week. For example, in the past month the average contribution of those who used envelopes was: \$32.20 (2/19), \$98.75-some contribute for the entire month at once-(2/26), \$49.20 (3/5) and \$32.76 (3/12). The average contribution of those who donated electronically for the last month was \$38.75 (2/19), \$31.25 (2/26), \$41.25 (3/5) and \$30.80 (3/12)

As noted above, almsgiving, tithing, and charity are not just in donating money, but also donating goods. I mentioned last week that St. Augustine says if I keep what I don't need, I am stealing from those who do need it. This can apply to my clothes, my books, food in the cabinet or belongings to a deceased member of my family. A few weeks ago, a gentleman who I did not know called and asked where he could donate baby furniture that his grandchildren no longer needed.

In two weeks we are going to renew our baptismal promises. As I mentioned in the past two weeks, to prepare for that it is good for us to carefully and thoroughly look at our spirituality of prayer and fasting. This week, I suggest we scrutinize ourselves in the area of the spirituality of almsgiving in our lives, especially as St. Paul says "as a cheerful giver."

Have a great Fifth Week of Lent.


