A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

There seems to be a sense of encouragement and cautious optimism in our country concerning the Pandemic. Although some cases of the virus continue to be reported (e.g. at a Lower Merion elementary school this past week), there are certainly less cases being reported as well as less hospitalizations and deaths due to the Corona Virus being reported. A higher percentage of Americans have been fully vaccinated, although that percentage is not growing as high as it was.

Because of all this, a number of restrictions, but by no means all restrictions, have been adjusted. For example, this past Tuesday the CDC (the US. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) removed some restrictions for fully vaccinated Americans pertaining to wearing masks while walking outside and hiking as well as some situations of eating outside at restaurants.

How does all this affect us in the parish as we want to proceed with cautious optimism as well?

Well, a few ways: In order to restore a sense of a procession of going to the altar, we have resumed with the presider at Mass beginning in the back of the church. Last week for the first time in well over a year we had an altar server at the 11:00 AM Mass. Although the six foot markers remain on the floor, we have removed the arrows. In consultation with the Parish Pastoral Council at our March meeting, starting with the blessing of the Easter Water at the Easter Vigil, we have replaced the Holy Water in the Holy Water fonts. In the discussion, it was pointed out that people were free to take advantage of this or not. This is to remind us once again that as we bless ourselves with Holy Water when we enter the church, that we are gathering with the other baptized members of the Church to hear God's Word and to celebrate the death and Resurrection of Jesus. The number of those participating at Mass has increased and a number of our Lectors feel comfortable resuming their ministry and are once again proclaiming God's word to us. Many couples who postponed their weddings have rescheduled them to take place in the relatively near future. We have several babies being baptized in the next several months (three this weekend) who understandably were not baptized in the past year.

Another thing which was discussed at the March Parish Pastoral Council meeting was the return of the use of the hymnals. We agreed that beginning in May (this weekend) we gradually would return to using the hymnals. As you enter the church, you will find a number of hymnals available on a cart for those who are comfortable using them. We ask those who use them to return them to the cart in the back of the church as they leave Mass. Those who sanitize the pews after each Mass will wipe them off as well as the pews. The reason for the use of the hymnals is to encourage greater participation of those celebrating the liturgy.

Just like the society in which we live, this is all gradual. Obviously, there are things we will continue to do and things we will continue not to do. We will continue the wearing of masks and continue to maintain social distancing. We will continue not to bring up the bread and wine at the Presentation of Gifts, not to physically exchange the Sign of Peace and not to receive the Eucharist under both species, namely receiving the Blood of Christ from the chalice. We wait from directives from the Archdiocese for these things.

It is an understatement to say that the pandemic has had a tremendous effect on all of our lives. This is certainly true in how we have celebrated Mass. We want to take advantage of the progress that has taken place and continue to move gradually to the ideal where once again we can have the full participation of all those involved in the liturgy. At the same time, we want to do all that we can to keep everyone safe and also to respect the comfort of each person.

We pray that the Holy Spirit will continue to guide us in these challenging days.
