

A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

First of all, I would like to wish a happy Mother's Day to all of our mothers, expectant mothers, Godmothers, grand-mothers, foster mothers and all those who are mother figures to us. Thank you for your vocation and for reflecting God's care and love to us.

Secondly, this Thursday is Ascension Thursday, 40 days after Easter and ten days before Pentecost. We remember that as part of the mission of Jesus, he completed his work on earth, physically left us, returned to our heavenly God and left us to continue his mission. We will celebrate this liturgically on Thursday at the 12:05 PM and 7:00 PM Masses. The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord is normally observed as a Holy Day of Obligation. Because the Pandemic, this obligation to participate at Mass this year is dispensed. As long as it is safe, however, it is encouraged to come together with the faith community to celebrate this solemnity.

Thirdly, I would like to bring to your attention that Saturday of this weekend, May 8th, is the 177th anniversary of the burning and destruction of the first church of our parish.

As we know, Fr. Matthew Carr, OSA founded our parish in 1796, 225 years ago. The first church was completed in 1801. The riots and burning of the church took place forty-three years later, on Wednesday night, May 8, 1844. The next morning, all that remained was a wall with the charred gilt letters "The Lord Seeth." Those letters remain on the back wall of our church today. This episode was certainly not the vision of the founders of our country for the City of Brotherly Love.

My understanding is that this took place when there was a rise of religious intolerance, variously called the Nativist, anti-immigrant, anti-Catholic, and Native American movement. Obviously, this caused a great deal of distress. New Irish and German immigrants worked tirelessly to build the church. A great deal of sacrifice, physical, emotional and financial, went into erecting it. They certainly didn't have the equipment we have today to complete such a mammoth task.

177 years ago, St. Augustine Parish and other Catholics were the victims of religious intolerance and the discrimination of new immigrants.

We need to keep in mind that in 1844 they didn't have the protection of law enforcement. As a result, a municipal police force in Philadelphia came into being.

We, as present parishioners, thank God that the parishioners of that day bounced back. In 1847-48, with great determination and hard work they built the church in which we worship today. We are the recipients of their incredible dedication.

Perhaps, this anniversary is an occasion for all of us to look at where we are personally and as a society in our outlook of racism, intolerance, and discrimination, especially to those who are new to our country.

It is hard for me to imagine what it was like for Fr. Carr and others to leave their native lands, Ireland and Germany. They certainly didn't have the means of communication or transportation we have today. They didn't meet on Zoom or text or email or even call others on the phone. They didn't take a jet "across the pond." There were a great deal of sacrifices and unknowns when Fr. Carr and the other immigrants came to "the new world" and settled at Fourth and Vine. And then, for all of it to "go up in smoke" and see everything "come tumbling down" because of intolerance, fear and discrimination it had to be extremely devastating for the parishioners of that day.

As we reflect this weekend on the anniversary of this sad aspect of our parish history, may we recommit ourselves not to repeat history, especially the history of which our ancestors in our own parish suffered.
