A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

As we celebrate Mother's Day this weekend, I was struck by the following article from the Catholic News Network:

"Pope Francis told Italian students he was shocked when a massive U.S. bomb used in Afghanistan was referred to as 'the mother of all bombs.' They called it 'the mother of all bombs' the pope told the Italian youths. But a mother gives life and this brought death.

The 7,000 young people were participating in a course on peace and human rights sponsored by the Italian ministry of education. They gave the pope sustained applause May 6th for his comment about the U.S. bomb, formally called the Massive Ordnance Air Blast (MOAB). U.S. forces used it in Afghanistan on a tunnel complex for suspected Islamic State militants April 13th.

Pope Francis told the young people they should be worried about the state of the world, which seems to be embracing a 'culture of destruction' when God made human beings to build, give life, move forward, create community and live in peace.

At the same time, he said there are millions of people in the world giving their lives in service to others. The vast majority of them are 'hidden' and never make the news, but they exist."

I was struck that 7,000 young people were involved in a course concerning human rights and that they gave the Pope a sustained applause when he spoke so strongly about life.

I was struck on the clever phraseology of the Pope that a mother gives life and yet we call a bomb which is created to destroy life a mother.

As we celebrate Mother's Day this weekend, we give thanks to God for our mothers who have given us life.

May we pray that the life our mothers have given us will never be used to destroy life, but will be used to sustain and respect life as well as to build community and live in peace.

Thank you mothers for helping to contribute to a culture which gives, sustains, nourishes and respects life. By living your vocation of motherhood you make a tremendous contribution to our society.
