

A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

First of all, Happy Mother's Day to all of our mothers, grandmothers, stepmothers, adopted mothers, and godmothers. This is a day set aside to thank you for allowing God to use you in various roles as instruments to reflect to us God's love, concern and protection. One of the ways we can experience God is through you. Enjoy the day which is dedicated to thank you.

This Thursday is Ascension Thursday and a Holy Day of Obligation. It is a feast that gives us hope. As Jesus said in last Sunday's Gospel, he is preparing a place for us. Having shared in his life, his suffering and death, we hope to share life with him in the kingdom. Masses on Thursday are at 12:05 P.M and 7:00 PM.

We are in desperate need for more Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist at the 9:00 AM and 7:00 PM Sunday Masses. We will have a preparation workshop in person three weeks from Wednesday, June 7th, from 7:00 PM to 8:30 PM. If you are interested in being an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist at either of these Masses, please indicate that on the signup sheet in the back of the church.

As has been announced for the last several weeks, next Sunday is Manna Sunday. This is a Sunday when many parishes in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia participate in a program to distribute food to the needy. The Padre Pio Prayer Center in Frankford will be the recipient this year of the donations from our parish. The Capuchin Friars in Frankford provide food for the needy there. There are special bags in the back of the church which you are asked to take, fill with non-perishable groceries and return next weekend. You will find in the bulletin and on a poster in the back of the church items which are needed this year, e.g. canned beef stew, tuna fish, canned fruit and vegetables, etc. Your generosity is greatly appreciated. We have a parishioner who has generously volunteered his time and truck to transfer the food to the Padre Pio Center on Monday, May 22nd.

As has been announced in the bulletin for the last several weeks, as always, the Sinulog will be celebrated on the 3rd Sunday of August. This year that is August 20th. Please mark this date in your calendar. There already has been one planning meeting. The next one is May 31st. Members of the committee are working on the journal (letters, ads, pictures, working with the printer, etc.), parking (what is available under the bridge and elsewhere), food, the Liturgy Aid for the Mass, and several other items. Please keep this preparation in prayer. Bishop Timothy Senior will preside at the Mass. This arrangement was made a number of months ago. Just recently, however, Pope Francis appointed Bishop Senior as the Bishop of the Harrisburg Diocese. Even though he will begin his new responsibilities on Wednesday, June 21st, he is very willing to come back to Philadelphia on August 20th to join us for the Sinulog. We are very grateful to Bishop Senior for his willingness to do this.

Several months ago, I informed you of the many different resources that are available for pregnant women. These resources (residences, medical consultations, baby clothes and furniture etc.) are especially available for those considering an abortion, those who may not think they have the resources to bring the child to birth or to help after the baby is born. There are booklets on the book rack in the back of the church that convey all these resources. Also, you will find elsewhere in this bulletin a QR code by which you can download this informative book. This is also available for you to pass on to anyone whom you think might find it helpful.
