# A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

Happy Birthday!

Today, we as Church throughout the world celebrate the beginning of our existence as Church. Jesus fulfilled His mission. He is physically leaving the world and leaving His mission to be continued by an unlikely group of people who were frail, fragile, weak, uncertain, and scared. But He told them that He would not leave them alone. He would send His Spirit to guide and energize them. Thus, Pentecost is the beginning of the Church as we know the Church.

It has been over 2,000 years since Jesus left His mission to imperfect human beings, but the Church, after good times and bad and sickness and health, still continues. It has survived many conflicts, starting with Saints Peter and Paul being in conflict with each other over the requirements needed to be members of the Church.

I often say Jesus did not give us the Church to make life difficult, but He gave us the Church because He knew life would be difficult. He wanted us to know that as we experience the difficult times that He is with us. If we are open to it, we can experience His presence in scripture, the sacraments, and each other. And others can experience His presence through us.

"What you do to the least of my people you do to me." • "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am." • "This is my body. This is my blood." • "I will not leave you orphan. I will be with you all the days of your life."

Over the years, including very current years, the Church has experienced various scandals. Remember no one person and no group is perfect! Immediately after His selection as Bishop of Rome, Pope Francis was asked how he would describe himself. His first response was, "I am a sinner."

The Church is us. We are the Church, in all of our imperfections. It is we who today as frail, fragile, weak, uncertain and scared people are to continue the mission of Jesus. This is what is known as evangelization--consciously continuing the work of Jesus. Sometimes this word "Evangelization" makes some people uncomfortable. They think it can mean standing on street corners or being obnoxious in the face of others. This is not what it means. We can continue the work of the Church (evangelize) in many subtle ways as sharing our time, talents and treasures for each other in the parish. It may be as simple as giving the parish bulletin to one who is not able to get to Mass, inviting someone to Mass or a parish event, letting people know about our parish, saying "God bless you" when someone sneezes (not just "bless you"), recognizing the anniversary of baptism of our children, grandchildren, Godchildren, wearing a religious symbol (as one would wear a Phillies hat or a wedding ban), not to be afraid to mention our religious activities in conversations, etc. It is not necessarily in dramatic ways that we continue the mission of Jesus. It is in very simple and ordinary things.

The important thing is that we are conscious to do it and that we remember we are not left alone to do it. Jesus has given us His Spirit to guide and enable us.
