


Monday, May 29<sup>th</sup> is Memorial Day and Daily Mass will be celebrated at **10:00 AM only**.



Dear Parishioners:

Please! pretty please! read the insert within this bulletin. I am very happy to inform you that we have exceeded our goal of raising \$750,000 in our Capital Campaign. The insert gives you a detailed report of the sources of the income (parishioners, the Augustinians, and grants), what projects were accomplished by the use of this money, what projects are beginning in the near future (upgrading fire alarm system in church, three automatic doors in the church and a fire sprinkling system in Carr Hall and the Women of Hope residence), the next steps in the process (beginning the St. Augustine Heritage Foundation) and what projects still need to be addressed. I and the members of our Steering Committee would greatly appreciate if you took several minutes to become familiar with all of the details of the campaign. If you have any questions or need any clarifications, please be in touch with me.

A very significant element of our parish community is that we have socials after all three of our Sunday Masses. Socialization is very important in building community, getting to know each other and building relationships. We have a need for more volunteers to help with the coffee and donuts after the 9 AM Mass. Naturally, some orientation will be provided. The cost is assumed by the parish, thanks to the second collection of the 3rd Sunday of every month. What is involved is picking up the donuts and making the coffee before the 9 AM Mass, serving the donuts after Mass. If you think you would be able to help with this important element of the parish, please be in touch with me. Thank you very much for considering this.

As I mentioned last week, we are in need of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion at the 9:00 AM and 7:00 PM Sunday Masses. There will be a preparation workshop in person on Wednesday, June 7th from 7:00 PM to 8:30 PM. If you are interested in serving the community in this way, please sign up in the back of the church.

On behalf of the Augustinian community, I would like to thank the 8 parishioners who donated \$1,165 to the special annual Augustinian appeal. This helps tremendously to provide the excellent care that our retired and informed friars receive. As time goes on and I get older, I am more sensitive to the need of this appeal. We are very grateful. Many thanks.

Dear Parishioners:

In 2015, St. Augustine Parish launched a Capital Campaign with a goal of raising \$750,000. I am thrilled to report to you that we have surpassed our goal. As of date, we have received \$787,976.68 in cash and \$10,437.17 from in-kind contributions.

This is totally due to the generosity of our parishioners and friends of the parish (\$494,976.68), the three Augustinian provinces in the United States (\$250,000) and grants (\$43,000). We have another \$45,000 committed from grants which we will receive soon and we have requested \$200,000 in the form of two other grants which are under consideration.

You will see below the projects which have been completed as a result of the campaign. In addition, contracts have been signed for three other projects which will begin soon: upgrading the fire alarm system in the church, three automatic doors for the church and a fire sprinkling system for the Women of Hope Residence and Carr Hall.

I am extremely grateful to the members of our Steering Committee who have advised me over these years. There is absolutely no way this could have been achieved without their guidance, insight, advice, and generous sacrifice of time. We all owe a debt of gratitude to our parishioners Gerry Rigby, Kathy Rigby, René Quinlan, Fran Richards and our staff, Jacob Marquart, O.F.S., Adam Klukiewski, and Tim Babbage as well as former Steering Committee members Ed Riehl, Melissa Higgins, and Bob Zigmund. As I say, this could not have been accomplished without them because Bishop Peter VanDiepen said nothing at my ordination about Capital Campaigns and renovating properties.

We are now moving into the next stage of this endeavor. We are developing the St. Augustine Heritage Foundation, (legally independent from the parish) as a non-profit entity 501(c)(3). The purpose of establishing this foundation is to receive grants from foundations/organizations that otherwise would not contribute to a religious organization. Our vision is "this will help in the areas of preserving, restoring and improving our historic buildings, grounds and our valuable artwork as well as supporting historical, civic, educational, and cultural programs."

A great deal of work already has been expended for this reality. We have received an Employer Identification Number (EIN) which means the St. Augustine Heritage Foundation is now a Pennsylvania corporation. We established by-laws for the Heritage Foundation which have been approved by the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. The next steps are applying for approval from the Internal Revenue Service and establishing a Board of Directors for the Heritage Foundation with members who have experience and expertise in such endeavors. We also are in the process of connecting with a freelance grant writer.

As you can see, much has been accomplished since 2015. There are still a number of projects that need to be addressed in the church (restoring the artwork), in Carr Hall (renovating the kitchen), in the friary (restoring wood windows, obtaining new storm windows, carpeting, air conditioning), in the Community Center (replacing a skylight). An approximate cost for only these items would easily exceed one million dollars. As you can see, there are many projects that still need to be addressed.

We thank God for all that has been accomplished, what presently is bring accomplished and we ask for God's continued blessings in the future.

Please continue to keep all of this in prayer.

- ♦ Converted the heating in the St. Augustine Community Center from oil to natural gas
- Restored two church restrooms
- Converted the church lighting to LED lighting
- Replaced the windows on the "East" and "West" sides of the Community Center
- Expanded the Preservation Account
- Secured the Stations of the Cross in the church
- ✤ Replaced two church skylights
- Created a wheelchair accessible restroom in the church
- \* Restored and repaired the painting of the crucifixion in the sanctuary of the church
- Restored the façade below the tower of the church (brick re-pointing)
- \* Assessed the cost to restore eight paintings in the church of St. Augustine's life
- Painted the outside church window frames
- \* Restored all the church pews and replaced the carpet in the church
- Replaced Church steeple louvers
- Restored the plaster on the wall near "The Sister Bell" in the church

- > Installing three double door operators in the church.
- > Installing fire sprinklers in the Women of Hope Residence and Carr Hall
