


Monday, May 29th is Memorial Day and Daily Mass will be celebrated at **10:00 AM only**.



A word from Fr. Bíll...

Dear Parishioners:

Happy Pentecost! Happy Birthday!

Jesus spent 33 years on this earth, three of which were revealing who he was as the Son of God and Savior of the world as well as teaching the apostles how to continue his ministry. He promised them that they would not be left alone to continue the work for which they were chosen and for which they were formed. He told them he would give them the Holy Spirit. It is this aspect of our faith that we celebrate today. With the gift of the Holy Spirit given to us on Pentecost, we celebrate the birth of the Church.

For over 2,000 years, the Church which Jesus gave us continues. Imagine overcoming all the obstacles, difficulties and challenges in the past 2,000 years and still being in existence today! How has this happened? It is by means of the Holy Spirit.

That same Spirit which strengthened and guided the apostles strengthens and guides us. The same Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead lives in each one of us. The gifts that the Spirit gave to the apostles are given to us.

Remember, Jesus said he did not come to do away with the First Testament, the Hebrew Testament, the Old Testament, but to fulfill it. One of the ways he fulfilled it was by giving us the gifts of the Holy Spirit which can be found in Isaiah 11:2-3. They are wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, awe and wonder in the Lord (used to be expressed as fear of the Lord).

What a world we would have if we all integrated these gifts into our lives. May we consciously pray for them. May we pray that we have wisdom as we make important decisions. May we pray for understanding when things are confusing. May we pray for knowledge when we don't know something and not pretend that we do. May we pray for counsel when we are giving advice or asking for it. May we pray for strength when we have to say or do difficult things. May we pray that we grow in our understanding and appreciation of God.

Jesus prayed that the apostles would have peace. We pray for that at each Mass. "Peace be with you." Jesus prayed that the apostles would be joyful: "May your joy be complete."


Jesus wants us to be joyful and to be at peace. Being open to the gifts of the Holy Spirit will help us to be joyful and at peace.
