A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

It is not infrequently that I hear any or all of the following said:

"I don't have to go to Mass to be a good person."

"I don't go to Mass as often as I should."

"I don't go to Mass but, I help out at the soup kitchen."

"I am spiritual but I am not religious."

Anyone who says any of these things can be a very good person and the person is certainly loved by God. But, this framework of mind does not take in the importance of the Eucharist in our lives.

This weekend in union with the entire Church we celebrate the feast of "The Body and Blood of Christ."

In the early Church the members regularly celebrated "the meal." This was critical and central to the unity of their community and for "the remembrance." It was a time, and it still is a time, when we tell the story of the Last Supper and we remember and celebrate with the community what Jesus did for us.

When we do something often (no matter what it is), it easily can become familiar, mechanical, going through the motions and we can forget its significance. This is why the Church in her wisdom gives us the opportunity this weekend to reflect on the great gift Jesus gave us by giving us His Body and Blood. May this be an opportunity for us to renew our understanding and appreciation of this gift which has been so central for us as Catholics for over 2000 years.

On another note, "Father Willy," who has been with us for three years, left this past Wednesday to return to his home and to his Augustinian community in the Philippines. While he was studying at Villanova during the week for a Master's degree, he helped us faithfully celebrate the Eucharist on weekends. It was extremely important for the many members of our community from the Philippines to have someone from their culture celebrate the Eucharist and the other sacraments with them. We will experience a real void without him for the next year. I say for the next year, because our Augustinian community in the Philippines is arranging for another Augustinian to come next year to study at Villanova and minister on weekends here with us. In the meantime, members of our Filipino community are investigating if there might be a Filipino priest in the area who might be able to assist us. As Father Willy returns home, he has been assigned by his provincial to serve as Vice President for academics in one of their schools which includes students from grammar school through college. We give thanks to God for Father Willy's presence with us for three years and we pray God will bless him in the next chapter of his life.
