



A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

As we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity this weekend, I reflect on the Trinity being the perfect community, each person (the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit) fulfilling each of their roles perfectly. Hopefully, we as a parish community, can imitate the community of the Trinity, each of us fulfilling our roles, building up the parish community.

One of the groups in the parish on which I am extremely dependent as Pastor of St. Augustine Parish is our Parish Pastoral Council. The Council has its unique role in building our parish community. The Council which is made up of a good cross section of the parish meets with me once a month (usually the 4th Wednesday of the month) for about an hour and a half. The purpose of the Council is to assist me with the pastoral needs of the parish. The directives from the Archdiocese of Philadelphia state: "The Pastor needs to consult with the laity who in turn have the right to express their views and concerns to the Pastor." Vatican II speaks at great length about the role and involvement of the laity in the Church. I find working collaboratively with the Pastoral Council is essential in my role as Pastor. I value the regular consultation with the council members.

How does it work here at St. Augustine Parish? In order that the Council members are informed of what is happening in the parish, at each meeting I give updates on various projects and activities in the parish. Hopefully, they in turn share this information with other parishioners. At each meeting there is an opportunity for Council members to share with me "things I may not hear," but which they hear.

Very specifically, during this past year the following are some of the topics with which I consulted the members of the Council and on which they gave me input and suggestions:

- \Rightarrow Implementing the directives of the Archdiocese in relation to the pandemic
- \Rightarrow Suspending the Saturday Vigil Mass
- \Rightarrow Restoring the pews in the church
- \Rightarrow Scheduling the times of the Christmas Eve Masses
- \Rightarrow Outlining ways to commemorate the 225th Anniversary of the parish
- \Rightarrow Composing the letter to parishioners for a fundraiser in connection with our 225th Anniversary
- \Rightarrow Suggesting ways to commemorate "The Year of St. Joseph"

The term of a Council member is usually three years. We are now accepting nominations for 3 parishioners to join 6 other parishioners and 3 staff members to serve on the Council and to collaborate with me about the pastoral needs of the parish. Next year, I very much would like the Council to work with me on reaching out to other parishioners.
