A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

As you know we have been announcing for the past several weeks that Fr. Jim McCartney, OSA, a professor of bio-ethics at Villanova will be speaking here at St. Augustine Parish in Carr Hall at 7:00 PM this Tuesday, November 3rd on "End of Life Issues." If you plan to attend, it would be helpful to let us know by calling the parish office at 215-627-1838. This will help us make appropriate arrangements.

Some of the guestions which have been submitted for Father Jim to discuss are:

What is the difference between a cremation funeral and a casket funeral, both logistically and theologically? (I know the prayers and internment are different... why?).

What is the (latest) Catholic teaching on Limbo, particularly in regards to unbaptized children who die before/during childbirth?

Are "extraordinary means" different in a NICU than they would be in an ICU (child needing help to get life started, as opposed to someone at the end of their life preparing to die).

Does it make a difference if a person receiving last-rights is unconscious, or cannot receive Holy Communion?

What does the Catholic Church really feel about "emergency-baptisms" (i.e.: grandma with holy water...roadside accident scene, etc.).

What types of resources exist for caregivers and adults who want to make a conscientious decision about end-of-life choices? i.e.: Is there a website? Can you contact your parish or archdiocese if you need council?

Is it permissible to make a decision not to put someone on a respirator?

If someone is placed on a respirator, can you make a decision to remove the respirator?

Is it permissible not to have someone receive a feeding tube?

If a person is receiving a feeding tube, is it permissible to remove it?

When is it permissible to place someone in Hospice care with the understanding the person will be made comfortable and no other means will be taken?

What does "Palliative Care mean?

What does "ordinary means" and "extraordinary means" mean? Is that the same for all people?

If a woman's life is in danger if she gives birth, can an abortion be performed?

What is Physician Assisted Suicide and does the church have a stand on it? Doesn't a person have a right to end his/her life, especially if the person is terminally ill and in pain?

Many of these questions become pertinent to most of us at one time or another either for ourselves or for others for whose care we are responsible. We all will be able to benefit from this conversation on Tuesday.

Hopefully you will be able to join us on **Tuesday evening**, **November 3**rd at **7:00 PM in Carr Hall**. Refreshments will be served. Let us know if you can attend.
