A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

As a reminder, we will have our second Theology on Tap after the 7:00 PM Mass this Sunday. The topic is "Exorcism and Spiritual Warfare." Our speaker is Monsignor Ralph Chieffo, Pastor of St. Mary Magdalen Parish in Media. Monsignor is considered an expert in this area as he has had a great deal of experience with this topic in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. He will be speaking about demons, jealousy, pride, gifts of the Holy Spirit, possession, expulsion of demons, etc. There will be adult beverages and munchies. A free will offering is always appreciated. Please plan to attend.

Four different groups are scheduled to meet each week prior to the four Sundays of Advent to reflect on the Gospels of Advent. There are very significant people, events and themes upon which to reflect: John the Baptist, Mary, Jesus, the Annunciation, being prepared, etc. Some have suggested to me that Advent is not a good time to be inviting people to do this because they are too busy preparing for Christmas. And I respond that this is exactly why we offer this opportunity at this time. That in the midst of the hustle and bustle of decorations, shopping, wrapping, parties, etc., we spend some quality time reflecting on why we do all these things. We not only need to be prepared for the Second Coming of Christ, we need to be prepared spiritually to celebrate the First Coming of Christ. It is very intentional that we have four opportunities to participate in one of the groups. If it only was one opportunity, many people could say there is a conflict with that time. We have the opportunities of Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings or Saturday morning. You will find signup sheets in the back of the church with the picture of which parishioners will lead each group.

After a year of preparatory studies, conversations, and meetings, **St. Augustine is ready to launch a Capital Campaign**. Across the 222 years of St. Augustine's history, thousands of people have worked and sacrificed for our parish. Now it's our turn to build on our rich history and prepare for the future.

As part of this effort, we need the help and cooperation of many parishioners who will take ownership of our capital campaign. In collaboration with Partners for Sacred Places (the resource agency assisting with our campaign) and the Steering Committee, we have scheduled a vital meeting on Sunday, December 10 from 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM. This town hall-style meeting and workshop will help us understand what the campaign is, how proceeds will be used, and the process for conducting this campaign - including how each of us can use our gifts to ensure its success.

While we will send invitations to as many individuals as possible – Parish Pastoral Council members, Parish Finance Commission members, Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Music Ministers, Home Cook Hero volunteers at Gift of Life, etc. – we want all of you to know that you are encouraged to participate in this informational meeting.

A great deal depends on the dedication and enthusiasm of St. Augustine parishioners in this effort. To help with making preparations for this meeting, we need to know how many will be attending. Please let us know you plan to attend by signing up in the back of church.

On Thursday evening, November 30th there will be a meeting to discuss the relationship between the Church and Catholics who are gay, lesbian, bisexual or transgender (LGBT). This is a very important, sensitive and timely topic. All are welcome in the Church. God created all people and Jesus died for all people. And the Church teaches certain values. What might be bridges (as Fr. Jim Martin, SJ recently entitled a book) to help this relationship.
